ON THE BRIDGE.

The following from the Brownsville Times is published at the request of several subscribers:

The proposed big steel bridge which is to span the Willamette river at Albany seems to be the absorbing topic, not only among the people of Albany but also among the taxpayers and citizens of Linn county.

A majority of the city council of Albany, together with three committee men appointed by the mayor, the mayor, two county commissioners and county judge voted on the 22nd day of April on the site of said bridge, Calapooia street being the site selected.

At a recent meeting of the city council of Albany it was voted that the mayor of Albany appoint three committeemen to help and have a voice in the selection of the bridge, and the mayor proceeded to appoint three men, two of which, like the mayor, were directly interested by having property in Albany which the location of the bridge would materially effect.

One of the councilmen of Albany gave as his reason for voting for the high steel bridge, "That he had heard that it would cost \$3000 a year to run the bridge, and as this would be an everlasting tax on the people he was opposed to it."

Both of the county commissioners voted against this location and they are to be upheld by the people for so doing; they will not and should not appropriate a cent for a bridge that is not what the people want and a bridge that will not be permanent.
