WORTH CONSIDERING.

A dispatch from Duluth, Minnesota says: Assistant State Geologist H. V. Winch has arrived in Duluth on his way back to the Thurston Bay silver district, where he has lately spent several months and where he expects to stay several more. "The mines up there are really doing remarkably well," said he. "At the Percupine, which is only down about 100 feet, they are taking out native silver in chunks as big as a bushel basket—silver that goes with what impurities it carries well up to \$50,000 a ton. I don't know how much of this kind of bonanza they will be able to strike, but they shipped away over twenty barrels of it the other day, and there was money enough in the twenty to pay for a good deal of work."

Cigars will be cheaper next year. The United States Government has notified Spain that it will favor a modification of the McKinley tariff as to Havana tobacco. TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Shooting Range.

SALEM, May 20.—John W. Smith has been living with his wife and family about a mile and a half northwest of Wheatland, Yamhill county. John Brooks, a lawyer and thorn gambler, well known in Salem, had been working for Mr. Smith on his farm. Smith became dissatisfied with Brooks, and especially his actions toward his (Smith's) wife and (discharged) him. This caused trouble between Smith and his wife, although they had before lived peacefully together. Mrs. Smith came to Salem the first of last week and met Brooks here. Her actions while here were not creditable to a sane wife and mother. Smith came to Salem and the result was a me livid shooting. When Brooks saw Smith he pulled his pistol and commenced shooting him. Smith returned the fire. Smith fired three shots and Brooks two. The men then circled and had a battle with clubbed revolvers as weapons. Brooks shot at the west of the light, and begged for his life and Smith for him alone. Smith was shot in the center of the forehead at the roots of his hair, the ball making a scalp wound and coming out on the top of his head. Brooks was shot twice, one ball entered his left cheek and came out through his lower jaw, the other entered his right cheek, cutting the roof of his mouth out and going out at the back of his neck. Sheriff Warren of Yamhill county arrested Brooks and took him to McMinnville for trial.

A Fatal Cyclone.

MEXICO, Mo, May 20.—A terrific tornado passed three miles north of this place this afternoon in the vicinity of Bean Creek. So far as heard from fifteen houses in the vicinity of that place were destroyed, ten or twelve persons killed, and equal number badly injured. A moving machine was carried about 100 yards and torn to shreds. A large iron roller, weighing 1200 pounds, was taken up and broken to pieces. The tornado passed on east, passing Rush Hill, one mile north, and carrying destruction everywhere.

A New Party.

CINCINNATI, May 13.—A little political giant was born into the world today, and a no more wonderful exhibition of lung power at a social event was ever heard. From early in the morning, when the great gathering eagerly voted for the formation of a national executive committee, the result was foregone, and all doubt was removed late in the afternoon, when Chairman Ignatius Donnelly, of the committee on resolutions, announced that the committee was a unit for starting a third party without an instant's delay. No name was secured for it.

For Arming the Militia.

WASHINGTON, May 23.—The secretary of war has made allotments of money to various states and territories for arming and equipping their militia on the basis of representation in congress. The Pacific coast distribution is: California, \$2,371; Nevada, \$2,764; Idaho, \$2,764; Washington, \$2,764; Oregon, \$2,764; Arizona, \$2,000; Montana, \$2,764.

Railroad Subsidy Committee.

ROSEMONT, May 20.—Messrs A. M. Crawford, A. C. Jones and George W. Riddle have been appointed by the Board of Trade to confer with the Coes Bay & Roseburg Railroad Company to fix the time and manner of paying Douglas county's quota of the subsidy to the same company.
