After this marriage he remained in Iowa 18 years. In 1876 he came to Oregon and bought a small farm where he resided until his death. Mr Eagy was a member of the U P church, and an honest, upright man.

William Brown was born July 12th, 1812, in Ohio, where he remained until 1860, when he and his family removed to Missouri. He came to this place in the fall of 1880. He was a member of the U P church, and an upright, Christian man.
