

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

French moved that the contract for building a bridge across the Willamette be let to the Portland Bridge & Building Co., agents for the King Iron Bridge Co., according to proposition 3 of plan 2, for \$83,350, and that the mayor and recorder sign the contract.

Burkhart objected to the motion on the grounds that it was contrary to section 37, which provides that the appropriation of money shall be by ordinance. Not allowed. Upon which Mr. Burkhardt stated that he would file a written protest.

The motion of French was carried.
