A French geologist has made a careful calculation of the amount of solid matter yearly carried off into the ocean by the action of the rivers of the world and other causes. He estimates that the reduction of the average height of the surface of the solid land is 0.066 inches each year. Making allowance for the corresponding rise in the bed of the ocean, and taking no account of the occurrence of volcanic and other exceptional phenomena—the general tendency of which is to hasten the process of denudation—the period at which the solid land will have ceased to exist and the surface of the earth will be covered with water has been estimated. As, however, that period is 4,500,000 years distant, the prediction need cause no immediate disquietude.

The only proper way to keep a gun barrel in good order is to wash it out with boiling hot water, dry with linen swabs, and oil with vasoline or cylinder oil, every time that it is used. It should never be laid aside unattended too for a day or two after firing.

The water of the central basin of the Mediterranean has been found to be warmer, denser and richer in dissolved salts than the western. While a white disk was only visible at forty-three meters, photographic plates were affected at 500 meters.

Much Ado About Nothing

BIRMINGHAM, Conn., July 12.—Huntington Center is still greatly agitated over the action of the sexton and warden of St Paul's Episcopal church, in having Olin P. Shelton arrested for ringing the church bell July 4, and the sexton and warden are the subject of much ridicule. All the patriotic citizens and the women and the girls of the town are on Shelton's side. The first outbreak occurred this morning, when the proprietors of the town hall informed the warden that the church could never again rent the hall for any purpose, unless charges against Shelton were withdrawn. The next shot came from the young ladies of the church, who are all friends of Shelton, and who informed the pastor they would never assist in a church entertainment unless the charge was withdrawn. The village harbor said he would never again shave either the warden or sexton unless the charges were withdrawn. As a result the warden has withdrawn the complaint, but the sexton is still obdurate.

A Bad E. R. Accidents

ASPEN, Colo., July 12.—A horrible railroad accident occurred at Aspen Junction last night. A special train was backing from the water tank to the switch to the Aspen track, when the rear end of a passenger coach crashed into an engine coming out from the roundhouse. The check valve on the side of the boiler was broken off and the hot water and steam poured into the broken end of the passenger car, horribly scalding thirteen passengers—five men, seven women and one child. All that was possible was done to relieve the sufferings of the unfortunate, seven of whom have already died.

A Dakota Storm

ST. PAUL, July 12.—The Pioneer-Press specials from various points in North Dakota report heavy rains during the past forty-eight hours, which have caused many washouts on the railroads and much destruction to property. A special from Mandan, N. D., says between 300 and 400 west bound passengers on the Northern Pacific stopped here today. Tremendous rains last night and this morning washed out a large number of small bridges and culverts, and portions of the track west of here.

A Reaction

LONDON, July 12.—Owing to the foul attacks of Timothy Healy upon Mrs. Parnell, a reaction is setting in favor of the Irish leader, both in England and Ireland, and Mr. Parnell has received a number of letters from Irishmen, to the effect that while not agreeing with him in his political course, they have no sympathy with Healy's disgusting abuse of his wife.

Mr Spurgeon's Condition

LONDON, July 12.—Mr Spurgeon is very low tonight and hope of his recovery is almost abandoned. Shells of telegrams and letters of inquiry and sympathy are constantly coming in. The bishop of Rochester to-day telegraphed for information of the condition of his life-long friend and added a prayer for his recovery.
