

## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

**It Looks Like War.**

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn, July 21.—The Buchanan rifles, of Nashville, and the Nashville light artillery with two galling guns, the Stone River guards, the Shelbyville guards and the Swannee cadets have arrived at Knoxville, and are preparing to go to Coal creek. It looks like war to the death. They comprise over 400 men. Colonel Sevier will take a picked scouting party to Coal creek today. The Lookout mountain guards are here awaiting orders, and say that they will do their duty, whatever it is, and sustain the reputation of Chattanooga. Brigadier General Carnes, of Memphis, will arrive this afternoon, and assume command of the state troops. The plan of action will then be decided on.

**A Dismal Fire.**

MERRYSVILLE, Cal July 21.—Fire started about 10:30 tonight in the large livery stable of N. V. Nelson, completely destroying the stable and over 100 tons of hay, besides a large lot of harness, vehicles and some dozen horses. The loss is about \$9,000; no insurance. Ogden & Son's wagon and blacksmith shop, on the south side, was damaged to the extent of several hundred dollars, but as the wind was from the south, the fire department had little trouble in saving this. Hugh McGuire's boiler works on the north, were completely destroyed, also the residence of Mrs. Martin, directly west and across the alley from the boiler works. The total loss is estimated at \$12,000.

**Balmaceda, the Tyrant.**

LONDON, July 21.—The following advices have been received from Chile, via Buenos Ayres: President Balmaceda has had shot, at Valparaiso, Richard Cumming, a son of an Englishman, who was borne in a casket. The prisoners are filled with suffering, without respect for age, class or sex. Two hundred persons are imprisoned at Valparaiso. No security is afforded to foreigners. Judges are removed unless they are friendly to Balmaceda.

**Against Payment.**

SALEM, Or July 21.—At a regular meeting of the city council this evening a remonstrance of citizens against paving the streets with any material other than gravel was presented and recommendations of property owners adopted. Plans and specifications for such paving will be prepared, and bids advertised for. Plans will be presented to the council at the next meeting.

**Seals Caught.**

OTTAWA, Ont, July 21.—According to the returns received at the fisheries department the number of sealskins secured by the British Columbia fleet in the waters of Behring sea up to June 30, was 17,800. The skins have been safely landed at Victoria. The owners this year have taken precaution to send up vessels early in the month for the purpose of collecting the catch from the different schooners.
