TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Heavy Earthquake.

YUMA, A T, Aug 9.—Reports continue to come in from the earthquake region at the head of the gulf of California. Cocoph Indians of a tribe which live near there arrived here yesterday. They tell a thrilling story. Early Thursday morning hundreds of mud volcanoes, which are some thirty miles off, burst into a violent eruption. Instead of mud, however, lava and flames were projected into the air. The Indians cowered, praying on the bank of the river. The air grew denser, and many infants were suffocated. At last a violent thunderstorm cleared the air, only to show tidal waves approaching with frightful rapidity. The water rose, swallowing their cattle, horses and grain fields, and driving them for their lives to the top of a mesa a hundred feet above the river. The earthquake shocks then began, the fourth throwing every one down, and seriously injuring many.

Dr Lindsay Injured.

PORTLAND, Aug 9.—Rev A L Lindsay, for many years pastor of the First Presbyterian church, and at present a member of the faculty of the Presbyterian Theological university at Oakland, Cal met with a serious accident yesterday afternoon. While on his way from church at 1 p. m., the team ran away and he was thrown out and rendered unconscious. The reverend gentleman was brought to this city and taken to the residence of his daughter, Mrs Robert F Hall, on West Main street. Rev Lindsay was unconscious last night, and it was impossible to learn the extent of his injuries. Owing to his advanced age it is possible he may not recover.

A Prominent Democrat.

PORTLAND, Aug 9.—Emerson W Judd, of Boston, who is at the Portland as assistant manager of the Raymond & Whitcomb Alaska excursion, is the secretary and chief executive officer of the New England Tariff Reform League. Mr Judd was entertained by the officers of the Tariff Reform League of Oregon yesterday afternoon. Being also a member of the Young Men's Democratic Club of Massachusetts. He said with regard to next year's election, I know from inside quarters that the most astute republican politicians expect Mr Cleveland to be the democratic candidate, and do not expect to defeat him.

An Old Judge Dead.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug 9.—Judge Ogden Hoffman died early this morning at St Lukes hospital, of paralysis of the heart. He has been ill with heart trouble since April 2, but at times so far recovered as to be pronounced cured. Friday another attack set in and this time proved fatal. He was unmarried, and had always lived in a club. He has been federal judge since March 1851, a term of over forty years. No other living United States Judge has been on the bench so long.

Blaine or Harrison.

WASHINGTON, Aug 9.—It is the deliberate judgment of many of the most influential republicans, who have lately congregated in Washington, that President Harrison cannot be the candidate of the party last year. Aside from the fact that he has made many and bitter personal enemies in the party since he was inaugurated, these gentlemen believe that he lacks that popularity necessary to carry the party through the next canvass. A great many of these men look to Blaine.

After the U. S.

BERLIN, Aug 6.—The North German Gazette semi-officially declares that Germany intends to conclude commercial treaties with all the powers, including France, insisting that all Europe must combine in self defense against America. The article asserts that Germany will aim at isolating the United States commercially rather than France.
