

#### IS ALUM POISONDES?

[Hab's Journal of Health.]

Wes Etta It Vassaille and Lulu Martin of discussion. Alum is used by many cot to Portland today to take in the bakers to whiten their bread, enabling "This question has caused a good deal them to use an interior flour. It is most extensively employed as a cheap substitute for cream of tarta- in the manufacture of baking powders. It has not been consid-ered immediately dangerous; although if continued it induces dyspepsia and obstin-ate constipation. But the fact that many cases of poisoning have occurred from the use of alum, puts the question in a more serious aspect, and prudent people will exercise caution in the selection of baking powders,"

"Under what conditions then, does this substance—formerly used only for mechanical or medicinal purposes—become poisonous? They are certainly obscure, and at present we can only surmise what they may be. We suspect that the cause xists in the individual poisoned; some ecu arity of the constitution producing a morbiu change in the secretions of the stomach, with which the alum combines and forms an active poison; or the secre-tions may be healthy but in unusual proportions, and that these less or greater proportions is combination with the slum constitute a poison."

"For example, two parts of mercury and two parts of chlorine form calomet, which is not poisonous, but change the propor-tions to one part mercury and two parts of chlorine, and we jet corrowive sublimate, which is a deadly poison.

wThen again we know nothing of the constitutional peculiarities. Why is it that one person can eat all kinds of green fruits and venetables with impunity, while the same course might cost another individual One person can handle poisor ivy and summe without being in the least affected; another is poisoned if he ap proaches to within ten fest of them. Out proaches to within ten feet of them. Out of a family residing in a malarial district, some of the members will suffer half the year with faver and ague, while the others will enjoy excellent health during the entire pear. Foods that are wholesome to some persons are actually polsonous to others. This is especially true of some kinds of fielt. There is no safety in taking alum into the somach, as it is shown to alum into the stomach, as it is shown to be always injurious, and often danger-ous." \* \*
