THE ORPHAN'S HOME.—A DEMOCRAT man today visited the orphan's home in company with Mr. J. H. Townsend. Work on it is being pushed at the present time by J. H. Campbell and son as contractors. The basement and second story will be completed and furnished ready for business in a few weeks. The rooms are large, airy ones, and the building is in a very healthy location, as well as a remarkably slight one. When completed it will be an ornament to Albany. The cost, besides furnishing, will be about \$10,000. Already the Ladies' Aid Society of this city, has several children awaiting a home in the building. Besides being a home for orphans it will be a hospital, in which department it is promised considerable of a business. The institution is one deserving a liberal support. A street car line will, it is confidently stated, be built within the coming year.

Among the six or seven in the electric street car that ran off a trestle in Portland last week was Miss Josephine Barnes, of this city, who was not injured.

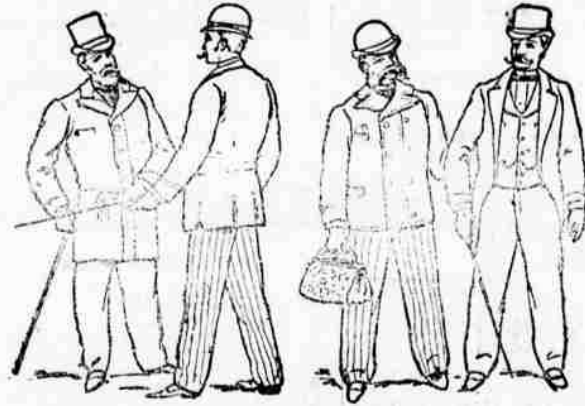
