Somehow our cotemporary seems to be muddled as to the number of presidential electors in the "solid south" or in New York and New Jersey. There are 444 votes all told. 223 are necessary to elect. The solid south has 159, New York 36, New Jersey 10 and these added, with the three from Michigan, make but 208 or 15 short of an election. But these will be easily made up from Indiana, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, Iowa and Montana.

A useful novelty is the invalid's teacup. It consists of a teacup and saucer, differing neither in price nor in size from the ordinary breakfast or teacup, but so made as to allow of a depression in the saucer, in which is placed a small cube of prepared fuel, by means of which the liquid contained can be kept hot for some time until the invalid is ready for it.

Russell J. Wilson, chairman of the democratic state central committee of California, has sued Irwin C. Stump, chairman of the republican state committee, to recover \$1,000. The action is based on the famous "Old Pard" letter which Governor H. H. Markham is alleged to have written to E. G. Hallock. The letter was industriously circulated during the last campaign. The republican state central committee, through Stump, as chairman, offered \$1,000 for the genuine letter written by Markham, claiming the one published to be a forgery. Wilson produced an "Old Pard" letter, but failed to convince Stump of its authenticity, and was therefore unable to collect the money, for which he now sues.

"The way to victory in 1892 has been made much smoother to the democrats by the elections of Tuesday," said Senator Gorman today. "Mr. Harrison and Mr. Blaine and the other members of the administration see this, and they do not contemplate the result of Tuesday's voting with any degree of satisfaction. They see the free coinage and farmer's alliance scares fading out of sight, tariff reform standing out boldly as the issue, and the practical certainty that a level-headed democrat will be the nominee of the democratic party in 1892 on a sound platform free from cranks and isms."

Blaine has a penchant for "reciprocity" treaties. He is said to have entered into a "reciprocity" arrangement with Harrison whereby it is agreed by and between the high contracting parties that Blaine, party of the first part, shall in no case attempt to influence republican politics in Indiana so as to secure delegates from that state who will favor him for the presidential nomination, and, "reciprocally," Harrison agrees that he will in no wise attempt to so influence republican politics in Maine in such manner as to secure delegates in the next convention for himself. Meanwhile the whole republican party seems to be standing in mute silence and permitting two men to direct and mould the policy of a party of 5½ millions voters. What a spectacle.

HINTS TO HOUSEKEEPERS.

Perfumed oil sprinkled on library shelves, such as oil of cloves, will prevent mould on books.

An "orange tea" may have orange-colored decorations, oranges served and used in many ways which may suggest themselves.

Too acid, too sweet or too watery fruits are the most indigestible. Berries, oranges and grapes are the easiest of digestion, because there are no tough fibres and no excessive amount of juice to be counteracted.

Oilcloth that has been in use and is soiled should be scrubbed clean, using as little soap as will be necessary for the purpose, and then varnished with oilcloth varnish, which costs about 50 cents a pint.

A warm bread-and-milk poultice, with a heaping tablespoonful of pulverized charcoal, will cure carbuncles. Apply warm, and when cold apply another.

The essence of peppermint will cure an inflamed eye. Pour five drops in half a wineglass of warm water and then drop into the eye.

Glycerine and rose water, mixed in the proportions of one-third glycerine to two-thirds rose water, is very good for the hands.

It is risky to attempt to decorate china that has been used, because if the glaze has become permeated with grease, which in course of time gradually happens, the colors cannot be successfully fired. Should you decide to make the attempt, cleanse the ware thoroughly first with hot water and soda.

To preserve vinegar for domestic purposes cork it up in glass bottles, set them on the fire with cold water and as much hay or straw as will prevent them knocking together and breaking. When the water nearly boils, take the pan off the fire and leave the bottles in it for a quarter of an hour. Vinegar thus prepared never loses its virtue, though kept many years or occasionally left uncovered, and is peculiarly suitable for pickles.

Beefsteak bones need never be thrown away, as they will make an excellent soup. Crack the bones in pieces and put them in a closely covered saucepan with just enough water to cover them; let them simmer slowly a couple of hours, then add two sliced potatoes, two carrots chopped fine and one sliced onion. If you want a tomato soup, add half a dozen tomatoes peeled and sliced, or tomato or vermicelli. Add as much water as you will need for the quantity of soup desired, boil for two hours, remove the bones, season serve.
