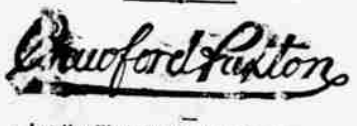

Miss Lola Allingham has been having a serious time with the rheumatism for about two weeks. It is reported that Mrs M A E Smith is dangerously ill at her home just across the Boundary. Most of the young people in this vicinity will dance at Coburg Dec 24th. Mr Burtch has moved his boarding camp from Coburg to Felix Barger's place below Priceboro. He boards fifty men, mostly Italians, who are ballasting the railroad. Mr Lee is planting quite a variety of small fruits, mostly strawberries. Hiram Curtis has been visiting his parents here, recently, but has returned to Washington where he will teach school the ensuing four months. The high winds last Thursday played havoc with fences and windmills in this neighborhood. One of our most popular young men mourns the loss of an overcoat since the Junction masquerade. The relatives of Mrs W J Bramwell here have been notified of her being dangerously ill at her home at Colfax, Wash, with but little hopes of her recovery. Don't Know Him. SPOKANE, Dec 8.—An insane man giving the name of J V Creighton and claiming to come from Albany, Or. presented himself to the sheriff today and begged protection against imaginary persons, who, he thinks, have designs on his life. He imagines himself to be in Portland, and wants the sheriff to go with him to the St Charles and Esmond hotels and arrest those who are plotting against him. The Cause of the Delay ASHLAND, Or Dec 8.—Unusually heavy rain storms have prevailed in Southern Oregon and northern California since last night. Heavy snows have fallen on the Southern Pacific, interfering seriously with traffic on the Southern Pacific. The southbound passenger, leaving here at noon today, was delayed by snow and icy track five hours between Ashland and Siskiyou, at the summit of the mountains. The northbound overland, due here at 4:10 o'clock this afternoon, cannot get here until late tonight.

Penitentiary Election PENDELTON, Or Dec 8.—The Pendleton city election yesterday resulted in the election of J C Leasure for mayor; T F Howard and Flickeringer, for councilmen; T B Morgan for marshal; Clark Wood, for treasurer, and George R Lash, for recorder. The latter had no opposition. The fight was spirited and 671 votes were polled.
