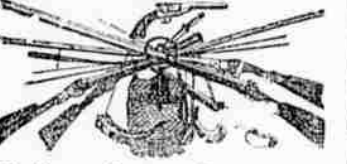

And some of the finest tea warms uses are allowed to be used. Even exhausted tea leaves are used for the tea houses are kept, which, and are not sent and their way into the market.

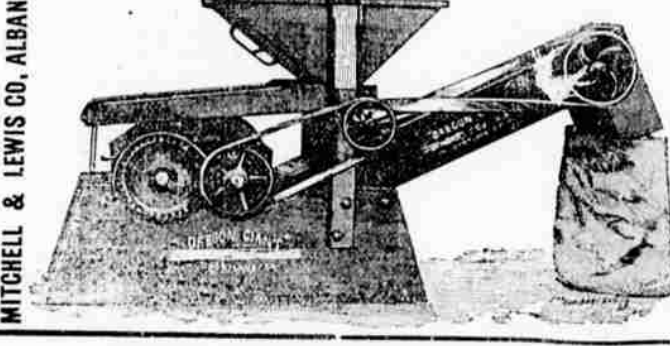
