FACTS ABOUT THE TEA WE DRINK.

That few people know that there is such a thing as uncolored tea in existence, and fewer have seen it. But there is, and it is of all teas the sweetest, purest, and most fragrant.

Green Teas. Few people know that the bright bluish-green color of the ordinary tea exposed in the windows is not the natural color. Unpleasant as the fact may be, it is nevertheless accidental.

Black Teas. The basket and pan-dried Japan teas, as well as the China teas that may be included under the general heading of "black teas," get their color from the firing or toasting process.
