HOLD BY ITS OWN PETARD.

The New York Press, referring to a statement made in the London Times to the effect that there was a less amount of tin exported from England to the United States in November 1891, than in November 1890, says:

It is a singular fact that among the three great items which the Times cites as instances of England's decrease in export is included tin plate, which it has been asserted in every democratic mugwump free trade paper in the United States for months, and is still asserted in their columns, is not and cannot be manufactured in this country.

In the same issue of the Press under the head of "Tariff Pictures" appears the statement that "in 1891 the United States exported 123,365 pounds of tin." This is equal to 55 tons of tin. This is less than one ton to every million of inhabitants in the United States.

THEY SPEAK OUT

On the 7th inst. the democrats of the several congressional districts in Indiana held conventions to elect members of the state central committee. At each convention the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That, believing adherence to principle is the foundation for success, and that resort to expediency is a sure forerunner of defeat in any contest where the interests of the whole people are at stake, we declare that the democratic party cannot afford to abandon its well established position demanding a general reduction of the war tariff which was so ably set forth by Grover Cleveland in his annual message in 1887, which was endorsed by the Democratic National Convention of 1888, reiterated by the democracy of the country in 1890, and sustained by the people in the election that year by a vote that cannot and ought not to be mistaken.

Therefore, in behalf of the democracy of Indiana, we demand of the Fifty-second congress a complete and equal reform of the tariff on imports such as will give equal benefit to all classes and special privileges to none.

Of course many prefer Grover simply because he is a resident of that state. Against any other candidate than Grover, Cleveland would have three-fourths of the body.
