TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

An Exacting Demand. New York, Jan 29.—The Herald's Washington special says: President Harrison will send tomorrow another ultimatum to the little South American republic. In substance this cable was sent from here by Blaine at an early hour this morning: "President Harrison accepts Chili's apology in the broad and generous spirit in which it was offered." A cable to this effect will follow: "While Chili's apology is in terms all this country could ask, yet there is one more thing to be done before the dignity of the United States be fully satisfied. Chili must salute the stars and stripes."

Blinded While at Play. SEATTLE, Wash Jan 29.—Willie Jackson, an Hiram-ville boy, was blinded this afternoon at Nye's harbor, on lake Washington, by a stump falling on him. Another boy had his leg broken in the same accident. The boys were playing, at recess, in a lot that was being cleared for the new schoolhouse, and a half burned stump, was tipped over on them while they were hiding under it. The boy's head was driven into the ground and he was dead before he could be rescued.

The Wheat Market. PORTLAND, Jan 29.—All wheat markets are in a very depressed state and values continue to decline. Outside of a few small parcels of Oregon valley, held at figures which prohibit trading, nothing is being offered; but shippers, being under no pressure to buy, are by no means anxious to operate at the present time. Quotations under existing circumstances are difficult to give. Exporters assert that \$1.50 for Walla Walla, and \$1.55 for valley, is full value for wheat now, based on values abroad.

Double Dealing. LONDON, Jan 29.—Newspapers of this city join in saying that the second message of President Harrison has confirmed the previous opinions they expressed, that President Harrison has been guilty of "double-dealing," and that he was aware of Chili's apology before the message was sent to congress. English newspapers, now seriously and briefly condemn Harrison and predict republican defeat in November.

A Bitter Contest. NEW ORLEANS, Jan 29.—Every federal officer in the custom-house was today arrested for criminal libel. The cause of the arrest lies in the bitter political fight which is being made in this state by both democratic and republican parties. The federal officeholders are arrayed against a faction of the regular republicans, and no end of political vilification is being indulged in.

Electric Lights. FOREST GROVE, Jan 29.—Forest Grove will be lighted by electricity within the next thirty days. The poles are now on the ground, the engines in position, and the location of the lights determined. Water works and a fine hotel are among the proposed improvements for the coming season.
