

CLEVELAND'S ATTITUDE.

An eastern dispatch says: There is a distinct line of division between the leaders in the democratic party.

In the house the anti-Cleveland men are found close to Speaker Crisp, while the admirers of Cleveland affiliate with Mills and McMillin.

Those who observed the progress of the speakership fight will recall the fact that all the anti-Cleveland forces were rallied to elect Crisp, Hill, Gorman and Brice.

Weeks have now passed and affairs wear a different aspect. Crisp has proved a disappointment. He was expected to use his influence in changing the sentiment of the south from Cleveland to either Hill or Gorman.

The failure to create an anti-Cleveland sentiment in the south has weakened the efforts of the combination. Mills, Breckenridge and Wilson have asserted that the south is prepared to nominate Cleveland.

With the south almost solid and the northwest practically so it has become an interesting issue with the enemies of the ex-president as to how they are to secure the votes to defeat his renomination.

The first thing they ran against was the organization in Ohio. It is still in control of ex-Governor Campbell and hostile to the Hill-Brice-Gorman combination.

When it was known that Brice and McLean would be in the field for delegates at-large Campbell notified them that he would oppose them by running himself and Allen W Thurman, the son of the recent candidate for vice-president.

These palpable failures of the anti-Cleveland machine have sent Cleveland stock booming upward in the past week. Cleveland's visit to Detroit on Washington's birthday is not alone for the purpose of addressing the law students of the university.

There will be a secret political conference held during his visit, in which the ex-president, Dickinson, Vilas, Daniel Linn and ex-Governor Campbell will be the chief figures.

The presence of Campbell discloses the hand which the ex-president will play in the case himself, if he finds it unwise to make the race. Rather than see the nomination go to Hill or to any other member of the Gorman-Brice-Hill combination, Mr Cleveland intends to throw all his strength for some outside man.

HILL AS A BUNGLER.

The revolt against the Hill machine is assuming greater proportions in New York than Mr Hill expected, and the Republic is free to confess that it is somewhat surprised at the immediate activity shown in resisting Mr Hill's bossism.

In calling his machine convention for February Mr Hill so openly declared his policy of tolerating no expression from the party in contravention of his plans that the honest democrats of the state are roused as they have seldom been before.

The movement for the overthrow of bossism is taking another direction, which promises to make it much more effective. Either by primary or mass convention a delegation is likely to be selected to go to Chicago to contest the right of the machine to represent the New York democracy.

Mr Hill's action shows that he knows nothing of politics beyond the first stages of packing conventions and that sort of thing, which is easily learned by the most amateurish boss.

This is the worst blunder any politician can make in American politics, and it is the blunder always made by the small-fry boss who thinks he owns the earth when he has only captured control of a committee.

The bitter fruit springing up as the natural and inevitable product of Senator Hill's "midwinter" convention in New York showed itself very forcibly in the elections for supervisors in several counties in that state last week.
