

WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22, 1892.

Speaker Crisp is at Fortress Monroe, and unless he disobeys the positive orders of his physician he will not return this week, although he said when he left that he would return in time to preside over the House on Wednesday, unless he was too unwell to do so.

It is estimated that not less than six weeks will be required for the debate on the three tariff bills, and as several of the appropriation bills will meanwhile be reported and disposed of, it seems safe to say that it will be May before the final vote is taken on the last one of the tariff bills.

The government printing office deficiency for the current fiscal year is \$385,000. Notwithstanding the immense appropriations made by the billion dollar congress, there will be a deficiency in nearly every one of the departments of the government.

Mr D C Mills, who is at the head of the syndicate which holds the Behring's Sea sealing privilege, was the fellow guest of Mr Harrison and Secretary Blaine at a dinner given by his old business associate, Secretary Elkins, an evening or two ago, and gossip says his coming here at this time is closely connected with the business before the Behring's Sea commission.

Representative Hunter, of Ohio, whose opposition to the free coinage of silver has given him considerable prominence of late, has handed Mr Holman, chairman of the democratic caucus, a request signed by forty old democrats, for the calling of a caucus on the silver question, and Mr Holman says he will issue the call this week.

The committee to investigate the Pension Bureau will hold its second meeting Thursday, when a day will be set to begin taking evidence, which promises to be voluminous.

Congress is in Chicago today, and the capitol reminds one of the middle of the long recess, so quiet is everything. The adjournment was only until tomorrow, but as there is not a quorum of either House or Senate here nothing can be done until Wednesday, when the excursionists will be back.

It seems strange that a man who was set down upon by the voters of the country as hard as ex-Car Reed, should still cherish political ambition, but he does, and he is working to secure the support of the Maine delegation to the Minneapolis convention to his presidential pretensions.

Considerable crowing may be expected from the protectionist editors over the fact that under the beneficent provisions of the McKinley act the American hen has increased her product to such an extent as to entirely exclude the pauper product of the Canadian hen from this market.

The convention of the assessors at Portland adopted the following resolutions:

Resolved, That it is the sense of this convention of the county assessors of the state now assembled for the purpose of considering all questions relating to assessment, that the assessment laws should be amended so as to reach results as follows:

First—That all assessments upon which it is proposed to levy and collect taxes should be made at a uniform time, to-wit: 12 o'clock noon of the first Monday of March each year.

Second—That the listing of property should be completed within ninety days from that date.

Third—That there should be no deduction on account of indebtedness and therefore no assessments of credits; that existing property alone should be assessed, and of the place of its actual location.

Fourth—That there should be provision for the enforcement of a lien on the property assessed, dating and attaching on and after said 12 o'clock noon of March 1, for all taxes levied for the current year under said assessment, but that said lien shall not be confined to the specific property assessed.
