GOOD EVENING

WOLFENBARGER AND HUCKINS. — A large audience was present at the W C T U Hall last evening to hear Wolfenbarger and Huckins, the Nebraska prohibition team. They are hard pullers. Mr Huckins opened the program with a song service, in which he is quite a free. Mr Wolfenbarger, an ex-republican journalist and lawyer, of Lincoln, followed with an address full of snap and fire in which he attacked both of the old parties, the new third party and claimed the great issue of the day to be prohibition, an issue affecting an annual waste of \$1,824,000,000. While he called the democratic a whisky party, he proved pretty conclusively that the republican was a worse whisky party, and declared that regardless of politics, outside of prohibition states not a single legislature had adjourned sober for many years, except that of Nevada, which immediately got drunk to celebrate the event. A petition in which the signer agrees to vote for a prohibition president when 1,000,000 names are secured in the U. S. was presented for signatures, and the meeting adjourned after a collection.

Wolfenbarger and Huckins will be heard at the opera house tonight.

THE PROHIBITION CONVENTION met this afternoon with an attendance of about forty. T P Hackleman was elected chairman and J E Knox, secretary. After remarks it was decided to adjourn until April 14th to nominate a county ticket. Resolved, That we do not favor the endorsing of a candidate of any party that refuses to place a prohibitory plank in its platform.

RETURNED ALONE. — Chief of Police Hoffman returned from Sacramento this morning. With Detective Day, of Portland, he went to San Francisco, but failed to get any clue of R L Kile, after whom he had gone. A detective shadowed Mrs Kile to Los Angeles; but Kile did not appear. She immediately left that city eastward. They undoubtedly had arranged to meet in Oklahoma. Kile only had \$6 when arrested, but it is probable Mrs Kile held the purse. The Sacramento Chief felt rather cheap over the unnecessary escape.

NEW SMELTER WORKS. — A meeting of the directors of the Albany Mining and Milling Co was held last night. Reports from the mines were very satisfactory. The company voted to organize The Albany Reduction Smelter Works. Capital stock \$50,000, principal office, Albany, the amount and value of the concentrates being so great as to justify it. Articles of incorporation will be sent to Salem tomorrow morning. This means a great deal for this city as well as the mines.

ALBANY IN IT. — Ding Minto, captain of the Salem B B Club was in Albany today on his way home from his North Santiam ranch. While here he had a conference with Manager Moorehouse of the Albany B B Club. The Albanians have decided to go into a velley league. The money has been raised, and a semi professional team costing \$750 a month will be secured, and negotiations are pending for the men. The league will probably consist of Salem, Eugene, McMinnville and Albany.

SMITH GUILTY. — Mr Frank Peterson and step son returned this noon from Astoria, where they had been as witnesses in the case of Smith, the darkey, arrested for the abduction of Lillian Young. Smith was found guilty, and was to be sentenced today. He will get one or two years in the penitentiary.

DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

Astron Ticket Nominated.

The Democratic County Convention convened at the Court House at 10 o'clock this morning and was called to order by T J Sides, secretary of the county committee.

On motion D P Mason was elected temporary chairman. G H DeVaney was elected temporary secretary.

On motion F Crabtree, M Sternburg, and Sam May were appointed committee on credentials.

On motion S M Garland was elected temporary secretary.

On motion the following committee on permanent organization was appointed: T J Black, John Biley and E E Montague.

On motion the members of the press were invited to seats within the bar.

On motion the following committee on order of business was appointed: J H Peery, E E Hammock, David Scott, Chas Pfeiffer and Scott Ward.

The committee on credentials reported delegates entitled to seats.

Report adopted.

The committee on permanent organization reported, recommending that the temporary officers of the convention be made the permanent officers thereof, which was adopted.

Committee on order of business submitted the following, which was adopted:

1, election of 16 delegates to the state convention.

2, nomination of 3 candidates for Representatives.

3, nomination of 1 candidate for County Judge.

4, nomination of 1 candidate for County Commissioner.

5, nomination of 1 candidate for County Clerk.

6, nomination of 1 candidate for Recorder.

7, nomination of 1 candidate for Sheriff.

8, nomination of 1 candidate for Treasurer.

9, nomination of 1 candidate for Assessor.

10, nomination of 1 candidate for School Superintendent.

11, nomination of 1 candidate for Surveyor.

12, nomination of 1 candidate for coroner.

13, election of county central committee.

14, that the viva voce mode of voting be adopted in nominating candidates.

On motion a committee of five was appointed to recommend 16 delegates to the state convention as follows: T J Black, C G Burkhardt, E J Lanning, C H Ralston, and W T Cochran. The committee reported the following, which was adopted: W R Biley, R Thompson, G W Wright, T J Sides, C G Burkhardt, Geo Humphrey, Geo E Chamberlain, T J Black, Dr E DuGas, Chas Ralston, G M DeVaney, Jeff Myers, I D Miller, Geo Finley, Worth Huston, Chas Pfeiffer.

The following names were proposed for representatives: A Blevins, C J Shedd, M A Miller, W P Elmore.

The ballot resulted as follows: Blevins, 80; Shedd, 47; Miller, 97; and Elmore, 79. Blevins, Miller and Elmore were declared duly nominated.

Geo Humphrey and J J Whitney were named for county judge. Humphrey received 56 and Whitney 45. Humphrey was declared nominated.

J W Grimes, B W Cooper, T J Munkers, Willis Potter were proposed for county commissioner. The ballot was as follows: Grimes, 27; Munkers, 51; Cooper, 23. Munkers was declared nominated.

The ballot for clerk resulted as follows: 1st ballot—C C Hackleman, 37; E C Stanard, 10; N Payne, 34; J P Galbraith, 20. 2nd ballot—Galbraith, 27; Hackleman, 39; Payne, 35. 3rd ballot—Hackleman, 38; Payne, 35; Galbraith, 28. 4th ballot—Payne, 55; Hackleman, 46. Payne was declared elected.

For recorder E E Davis received 82, and W A McGhee, 19. Davis was declared nominated.

C C Jackson received 55, and M Scott 46 for sheriff. Jackson was declared nominated.

Brice Wallace received 55 votes and W B Smith 46 on last ballot for Treasurer. Mr Wallace was declared nominated.

Ira Munkers, Enoch Miller, H S Williams, T J Edwards, and J E Michael were named for assessor. J E Michael was nominated on the third ballot.

G F Russell, F M Mitchell and L M Curt were named for school superintendent. G F Russell was nominated on second ballot.

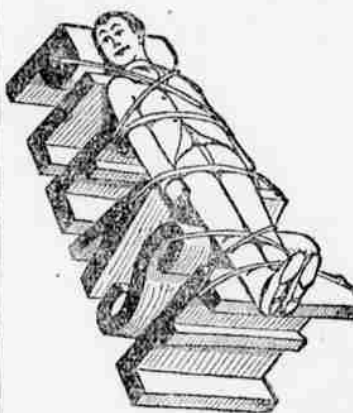
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
