

THE PREVAILING SENTIMENT.

T Carsey, a commercial traveler from Nashville, Tenn., was seen at a downtown hotel today by a reporter and asked about the political situation in the districts through which he travels.

"In Kentucky," he said, "the favorite-son boom has been exploded unusually early this year. Of course, no body doubts that Kentucky is very fond and proud of Carlisle, as well it may be, and, in certain contingencies, would delight to elevate him to the presidency; but the great mass of Kentucky people are attached to Cleveland, and firmly believe that his nomination is essential to the assured success of the democracy.

"Illinois has its proper admiration for Senator Palmer, and would doubtless be disposed to be complimentary to him, but the first and sincere choice of the Illinois democracy and of Palmer himself is Cleveland. Senator Palmer recognizes this and points out the embarrassment of his own candidacy in that it would take a democrat out of the United States senate.

"As for Missouri, it may be Cleveland or nothing. It comes as near that as any state in the union. The Cleveland sentiment is overwhelming. It comes out at every democratic meeting, and in every democratic newspaper in the state.

"I don't think Palmer, Boies or Hill will be mentioned in any of those states, and the feeling of the three can be taken as a criterion as to the way the surrounding states will go. It is quite a while ahead yet to look, and to offer an opinion as to the political feeling in the states by stopping only in the large cities of each and getting information from a few of the business men is a matter which should not receive too much credence. At present, however, that is the way things look, from all that can be learned."

COUNTY POLITICS.

Marion county farmers have a right to expect a reduction in county taxes. There are good reasons for this. Most of the county taxes are paid by farmers and most farms have to be supported by the hard work, enterprise and good management of the farmer and his family.

There is a well-founded belief that too many bills against the country are allowed which should be cut some. At the last term of court out of about three hundred bills four or five were cut in trifling sums and the rest went through for their face. In Polk county at the same term nearly twenty five per cent of the bills were cut in quite large sums. It is either to be assumed that Marion county people are more honest than Polk county people, or that the county court over there scrutinize the bills more closely.

The fact that our county and city taxes are too high cannot be denied by anyone. That such taxes are not higher than in some other towns and cities is not a good argument; why a fight shall not be made for reducing taxes. Certainly, if the fight is not made taxes will not come down. Not only in the county court, but in all the county offices there is room for reform and economy and in many counties of the state there is proposed a cut of as high as thirty per cent in fees and salaries.

Some days ago the Journal intimated that county business in Linn was not properly done. This calls for a showing which we will take the trouble to make in a few days.

Ex-Gov George W Glick, of Atchison, Kan, says that the democratic and people's state central committees have arrived at an understanding by which the democrats will certainly get three congressmen from this state. "The democrats," he says, "will support the people's electoral ticket, and in exchange the people's party will give us the congressmen-at-large and two places on the state ticket."

Why is it that China and Japan, after remaining for thousands of years in a state little short of barbarism, under conditions of perfect "protection," enjoying a perfect protection's ideal of a "home market," began at once to thrive and advance as soon as freer trade and exchange was had with foreign nations? How is the American farmer or "wage earners" benefited by a protective tariff? Who pays the tariff tax? What causes the reduction in price of quinine, sugar and matches? Was the "manufacturing occupation" of making quinine "destroyed" in the United States, when quinine was put on the free list? What is the percentage cost for labor, in England, for manufactured goods of wool, iron, etc.? What is it in the United States? Why are wages in unprotected industries higher in Chicago than in New York?—Telegram.

"I am just the least bit alarmed over the unanimity of sentiment among the democrats of the northwest for Cleveland, and I should like to see a split somewhere," said Gov Merriam, of Minnesota, the other day. "The republican candidate, I believe will be Harrison, Minnesota is practically sold for Harrison, and I have heard of little opposition to him. The state delegation may not be instructed for him, but it will fall in line when the vote is taken." Speaking of the alliance movement, the governor said he looked for a coalition between the alliance people and the democrats of Minnesota, "in which event," he said with a smile, "the combination would make it very warm for us. The alliance movement will not last long, however. Like the Greenback craze and the prohibition agitation, it will flourish for a while and then die out, and its members will be absorbed by one of the two great parties. There can never be more than two great parties in this country, in my opinion."

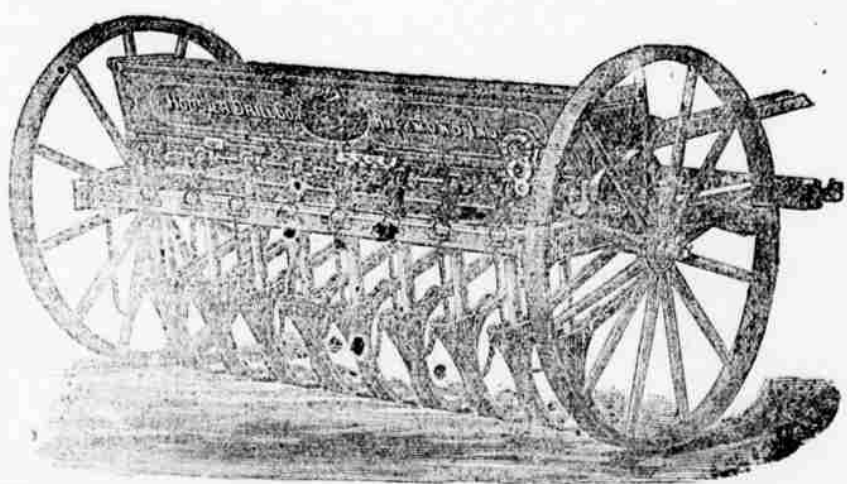
