Kansas will be solid for Cleveland.

An expression of the day in the mining camp of Creede is: "Don't jostle that fellow he may be a millionaire to-morrow and resent the insult."

Massachusetts will elect 50 delegates to-day to the national democratic convention all pledged to Cleveland.

They say the chances for Tilman Ford to be elected to the legislature from Marion county is slim. The same is said about Sherman for Clerk.

Charles D Drake, late Chief Justice of the Court of Claims, will be long but not gratefully remembered in Missouri as the principal author of the Drake Constitution which represented too many of the hatreds of the war.

The republicans elected the governor and legislature in Rhode Island. The following is the vote on governor: Brown, republican, 27,466; Wardwell, democrat, 25,416.

The total vote was 54,746, an increase of 11,000 over the highest vote ever cast before.

The statement is made that Secretary Blaine intends resigning from the Cabinet and residing in the south, probably Mississippi or Louisiana. This, of course, means permanent retirement from politics. But the statement requires confirmation, and a great deal of it.

Mr Alger says he cannot withdraw from the contest for the presidential nomination without "shrinking his duty." Well, the withdrawing will be done as painlessly as possible in the convention. Blaine, too, means to hold on to his lightning-rod till the storm is over.

Gov McKinley has authorized the announcement definitely that he is not a candidate for the republican nomination for presidency this year. He says that President Harrison has given the country a strong and patriotic administration, and will, he thinks, be nominated.

It is difficult to estimate the number of republicans in Linn county who are more than disappointed at the defeat of Judge Boise for re-nomination for judge. Many democrats are likewise disappointed. It was rejecting along tried faithful judge for a young, inexperienced man whose fitness must be acquired by experience.

The Springer wool tariff bill passed the lower house yesterday by a vote of 194 to 99. It will now go to the senate when it will pass if senators vote for their sentiment. But the republican senators from the northwest will not likely represent the sentiments of the people of the northwest for fear of putting Harrison in an awkward attitude.

Linn county republicans in the state convention never are in it. Time after time have they gone up to the state convention asking recognition on the ticket but they have uniformly been cast aside. They are not in it. We should say the party could not expect them to do much when the election comes off.

Every body knows wool is low and a drug on the markets, yet for the month of February 1892 there were imported from foreign countries 13,891,536 pounds while for the month of February 1891 there were imported only 11,759,010 pounds. More wool is imported under the McKinley law than under the old law although the former increased the rate of duty. The wool grower will look in vain for his benefits under the new law.

In nominating Barnett for Judge of the 3rd Judicial District the republican convention in selecting a candidate for that important office seems to have commenced at the tail of the profession and selected a small lawyer who after 15 years of practice had, in Marion county, at the last time of the court, but eight small cases on a docket of over one hundred cases.

In selecting candidates for judges of courts of general jurisdiction it should be the rule to select candidates from the head rather than the tail of the profession.

Ex-Senator John James Ingalls in a recent interview at Atchison, Kan., said Cleveland was the only man the democrats could hope to elect president this fall and he believed they would nominate him. He hoped, however, that they would nominate Hill or Boies, either of whom, he said, could be easily defeated by the republican party. "This man Hill," continued Ingalls, "who is lipprodding about the country in search of support would carry fewer votes than any other democrat who has presidential aspirations. Cleveland is a wooden man, but he is better than Hill."

Next Wednesday Pennsylvania will hold her democratic state convention and will elect 62 delegates to the national democratic convention. The contest so far as conventions then held will stand:
