

WAR AT MONROE.—The following from the Times of Corvallis is followed by an affidavit by Keeney and others mentioned in the item, to prove that there was nothing in the position of his antagonist: There has not been such excitement here since the war as there was on Thursday, the 7th. It seems that Preacher Wallace passed through town on horseback, as Mr. Geo. Keeney passed the other way on foot. Respectable witnesses say they did not even speak to each other. Green tea, being in this country especially popular, are produced to meet the demand by coloring cheap or black kinds by glazing or faking with Prussian blue, iron pyrites, and indigo. This method is so general that very little genuine uncolored green tea is offered for sale."
