

BALANCES OF TRADE.

A century or more ago, when the laws of trade and the nature and function of money were little understood, statesmen believed that the wealth of a country was to be estimated by the quantity of gold and silver in it.

These ideas, although long exploded, are such essential parts of the protective system that they are continually cropping out in the arguments as they continually live in the thoughts of the defenders of that system.

This very excess of imports over exports is, in no small measure, made up of the commodities sent from all parts of the world to pay debts and interest due in England.

Let us see now what the report lately issued by the bureau of statistics shows as to our own foreign trade during the seven months ending January 31st of this year.

But the special point to which I wish to call attention is that during these seven months we exported \$163,000,000 more than we imported. This is the very state of trade that protection aims to bring about by its checking of imports.

Adding these to the amount already stated and we find in eight months the great sum of \$193,000,000 merchandise and money "absent and unaccounted for."

Warner Miller one of the great republican leaders of New York is now in Portland. He says that Cleveland will be nominated. He says no democrat can carry New York this fall.

A year or two ago the democratic state conventions and nearly all the democrats in both branches of congress were crying out for free coinage of silver.

Henry Waterson in the Courier-Journal says the nomination of Cleveland would mean the surrender of the election in advance.

Michigan has in fact elected her delegates to vote as a unit for Cleveland.
