

In the state of Wisconsin Harrison lost 5,575 votes and Cleveland gained 22,216 votes, as compared with the vote of 1888, and in Illinois Harrison gained only 8,815 votes, while Cleveland gained 88,003 over 1888.

Nearly every one of the prominent Democratic tariff reformers in Congress is in favor of an extra session. The Democratic press of the country almost without exception take the same view. The Courier believes that to delay tariff reform a year and a half would hazard the success of Democracy in every one of the Western States in 1894.

It is difficult for the "rule of three" democrats to realize that New York and Indiana are no longer "pivotal states." The states of Illinois and Wisconsin have joined the list of certain democratic states, and they will certainly be recognized as such by the incoming administration.

The tariff reformers of the country would feel much safer with Hon William L. Wilson, of West Virginia, in the speakers chair. It cannot be denied that there is a lack of confidence in Mr. Crisp's sincerity on the tariff question, and there is fear that he may use the speakership to defeat the aims of true tariff reformers.—Ex.

The most lofty place in the world regularly inhabited by human beings is the Buddhist monastery of Haine in Tibet, which is about 17,000 feet above the sea level. The highest inhabited spot on the Western Hemisphere is Galera, a railway station in Peru, which is 15,635 feet above the Pacific level at low tide.

The official vote of Louisiana gives Cleveland 87,922 votes and the Harrison-Weaver fusion ticket from 25,352 to 26,663 votes. The fusion Electoral ticket consisted of five Harrison and three Weaver men, and the Weaver candidates received 1,331 more votes than the Harrison men.

A correspondent of the DEMOCRAT wants to know "how many states Weaver carried by the strength alone of the people's party." He did not carry any. In Kansas, Colorado, Nevada, Wyoming, Idaho and North Dakota, the Weaver electors were elected by the assistance of the Democratic vote. The congressman elect in California, [Mr Cannon,] to whom our correspondent refers, was nominated by the populists and democrats. Had he not received the democratic vote of the district, he would have been defeated.

On several occasions the DEMOCRAT has called attention to the unreliability of the Washington correspondent of the Oregonian. It is unsafe to rely upon any of his statements unless they are known to be true. The character of his statements is illustrated in that one in which Leon Abbot is put down as an anti Cleveland Democrat. The masses of people have not forgotten [if the correspondent has,] that Leon Abbot was an original Cleveland man and made the nominating speech at the Chicago convention.

Having failed to beat Cleveland at the polls, the Oregonian's Washington correspondent has sweet revenge. In exposing to the world the most secret thoughts and expectations of the democratic party and president elect. Hardly a day passes that he does not get them into a seemingly inexplicable tangle. In Montana, Wyoming and Kansas the Republican managers are doing their best to overcome by fraud the legislative majorities against them. In Montana they are following the same tactics through which they formerly succeeded in stealing the Senatorships of that State. Where the Democrats and Populists have fairly won victory, let them resolve to hold it fairly at all hazards. Every Democrat and every Populist should make common cause against Republican fraud. Attempts to bribe either Democrats or Populists to act with the Republicans should not be allowed to pass unpunished. Every man who is doubtful enough of his duty to be approachable should be watched. And where the Republicans adopt their favorite policy of throwing out Democrats enough to make a working Republican majority, they should be taught that forbearance with fraud has its limits.

If Democrats and Populists can act together so as to prevent treachery, they will be able to prevent the success of fraud. The necessity of the situation in the West and Northwest is harmonious action between Democrats and Populists to prevent the return of Republican Senators. No Democrat should stand in the way of such co-operation, and no Democrat can stand in the way of it without giving occasion for the gravest suspicion of his motives.
