

A GREAT AND GROWING POWER.

The action of the federal supreme court in granting an injunction against the secretary of the interior is a still further enlargement of the continually enlarging powers of the federal courts.

It is not always easy to tell what the coordination is or when it ends in a government of departments with co-ordinate powers, but under the system of triple checks there must be a highest authority somewhere in fact if not in theory.

It may be safely asserted that it was never intended that the courts should exercise any positive power in this direction, or that they should do more than check the legislative and executive branches by declaring that acts in violation of the constitution are null.

In very many respects the federal courts are essentially tyrannical. In their enforcement of penal statutes they deny one of the fundamental principles of local self government—the right of any person accused of crime to a trial at his own home, among his own neighbors.

While it is well enough that any further assumption of power by the supreme court should tend to check the executive, it is certainly pertinent to ask what is to be the check on the supreme court in the exercise of its perpetually increasing power.

We are told by the dispatches that Senator D B Hill says he is a Murphy, [who will be elected senator from New York] will be obliged to support Cleveland whether they want to or not.

It is stated the autopsy on the body of General Butler showed the cause of death was the bursting of a small blood vessel in the brain, caused by a violent fit of coughing.

President Fulton of the Senate, in making up his committee manifested his discriminating judgment in the selection of Senator Weatherford as a member of the judiciary committee.

Mr Fulton, president of the senate, in making up his committee on assessment, completely ignored western and southern Oregon, Northwest Oregon, [Portland] gets two of the members and eastern Oregon gets three.

Minnesota, Davis, rep, 61; Lawler, dem, 49; Owen, pop, 23. Davis will be elected today.

New York, Murphy, dem, 90; Hiscock, rep, 64; Whitelaw Reid, 1. Murphy will be elected today.

Indiana, Turpie, dem, will be elected today.

Montana, Sanders, rep, 31; Clark, dem, 23; Dixon, dem, 11; Collins, pop, 1.

West Virginia, Faulkner and Camlen have combined, the former to succeed himself and the latter to succeed Kennas just deceased. Hale was elected in N H. Bate in Tennessee and Quay will be in Pennsylvania.

The suit to compel the Southern Pacific Railroad Company to accept the freight rates prescribed by the Railroad Commissioners has been decided by the supreme court of the state against the Railroad Company.

The proposed amendment to the constitution of the United States providing for the election of U S Senators by the people passed the lower house of Congress Monday. Most of the republicans opposed it.
