

WHAT EDUCATION DOES.

Among the most significant incidents of the presidential campaign was the statement before the national republican committee of a representative of the "College Republican League." He said that college men usually graduated as democrats even when they had been brought up in the republic's political faith and entered college with strong republican convictions.

It is a glorious vindication of the democracy that liberal education only serves to strengthen its ranks. The hope of the country is in the intelligent and educated youth whom our colleges are sending out into the world.

Whether the representative of the "Republican College League" succeeded in getting any money from the committee we do not know, nor is it a matter of any consequence. The election of November proved that collegiates of republican antecedents were still graduating as democrats and voting their educated opinions.

The American college is a good thing. But those hidebound republicans who do not want their sons to become democrats would better keep them at home. The college is not a safe conservatory for modern republicanism.

SALARIES OF GOVERNORS

The governors of the several states receive salaries as follows: New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania \$10,000 each; Ohio \$8000; Illinois and California \$6000 each; Colorado, Indiana, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, Virginia and Wisconsin \$5000 each; Maryland \$4500; Connecticut, Louisiana, Mississippi, Tennessee, Texas and Washington \$4000 each; Florida, South Carolina and Utah \$3500 each; Alabama, Alaska, Arkansas, Georgia, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, North Carolina, North Dakota and Rhode Island \$3000 each; West Virginia \$2700; Arizona, New Mexico and Oklahoma \$2600; Nebraska, South Dakota and Wyoming \$2500 each; Delaware, Maine, Michigan and New Hampshire \$2000 each. Oregon and Vermont \$1500 each.
