

CIVIL SERVICE.

Robert M Collier, chief clerk of the railway mail service, has been interviewed about the service and among other things says:

So far as our department is concerned the civil service laws and regulations have been lived up to both in spirit and letter.

Many have the impression that the next administration will either suspend or modify the law. Inasmuch as the department was placed under civil service by Mr Cleveland, it stands to reason that he will continue it unless his will is overruled by the spoils element.

We regret that Mr Collier did not see fit to state the following facts: The civil service laws were not applicable to the railway mail service until Mr Cleveland, while president, made an order making these laws applicable to that service, and just as soon as Mr Harrison took his seat as president he issued an order suspending the order of his predecessor until the service could be largely filled by removing democrats and giving their places to republicans.

There is evidently some hope for "bleeding Kansas" yet. The legislature of that state is composed of some eighty republicans and about the same number of populists, (though there is a dispute over the seats of about ten members) besides four or five democrats.

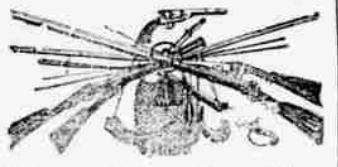
