## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

### Contrary as Usual

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 12.—The following reply has been received from Governor Penoyer in relation to the question of the annexation of Hawaii: The main benefit to be derived from the annexation of the Hawaiian islands to the United States would be a closer commercial relationship. This can be as well secured by the removal of tariff restrictions as by annexation. It is, indeed, quite questionable whether the people of the islands are competent to maintain a respectable state government, while annexation with the purpose of keeping them in a condition of perpetual territorial dependency is entirely alien to the spirit of our constitution.

### France in It

NEW YORK, Feb. 12.—The sentence of De Lesseps and the other Panama criminals is thought severe, and Paris cries out against the cruelty of condemning to five years' imprisonment an old man, who having in other days done great things for France had more recently robbed her of a few hundred millions. The real truth is better expressed in London, by the Times: "The sentence of De Lesseps is a sentence on France, and the ignominy poured down on that feeble old man is a degradation for the people who flattered and caressed and glorified him as long as the capital was left to spend."

### Killed While Tobogganing

MONTREAL, Feb. 12.—A tobogganing party, consisting of Miss Jane Crawford, of Windsor, Ont., aged 16, her eldest sister, Mary Crawford, and Mr. Montgomery, of Montreal, were coasting from Cote des Nigres hill, a very steep public thoroughfare, leading from the mountain into the city, last night. Montgomery, who was steering, lost control of the toboggan which was going with lightning rapidity, and at a turn in the road the toboggan ran into a telegraph pole. Miss Jane Crawford, who was sitting on the front of the toboggan, was dashed head foremost against the pole and instantly killed, her skull being terribly fractured.

### Two For Certain

LAKEWOOD, N. J., Feb. 12.—As yet no official announcement has been made regarding any one of the portfolios. It is practically settled, however, that Walter Q. Gresham has been offered the portfolio of state and has accepted, and that John G. Carlisle will be secretary of the treasury. These men have admitted enough to remove all doubt, so far as they are concerned.

### A Woman Company

CHICAGO, Feb. 12.—An application for a certificate of incorporation for the Woman's Insurance Company of Chicago, will be forwarded to Springfield tomorrow, with a list of prominent men and women as incorporators. The company is capitalized at \$250,000. It is not the purpose of the company to confine its business to insuring the lives of women, but simply to do a life insurance business without discriminating against women.

### High Water

TACOMA, Wash. Feb. 12.—The precipitation of moisture since January 25 amounts to 8 1/2 inches. This is unprecedented, one seventh of the average of the rainfall of the year having fallen in 17 days. The rivers are rising and damage is feared. Observer Culver says, in a bulletin issued tonight, that the indications point to a continued rain.
