STATE LEGISLATURE.

The following bills were placed in Governor Penney's hands Saturday:
Senate—Cross, to fix salaries of sheriff recorders and clerks; Woodard, recording of wills; dates, to protect game, fish and wild fowl; Willis, for lighting state buildings and purchasing electric plants; McGinnis, repealing state board of charities; Willis, amending code relating to jurors; Weatherford, consolidating school districts in cities; Alley, for propagation of salmon in the Siuslaw; Blackman, pertaining to election; Matlock, for branch insane asylum in Eastern Oregon; Blackman, to regulate the amount of money paid on insurance policy; Bancroft, providing for insurance of bonds for street improvement; Myers, making counties liable for damages by reason of defective roads or bridges; Blackman, to amend code relating to persons who cannot testify; Dodson, fixing time for holding circuit court in the sixth district; Blackman, for efficiency of deafmute school; Butler, to amend code, estates in dower; Bancroft, to define and punish obstructionists; Cross, collection and return of taxes; Denny, to enable married women to convey real estate; Denny, distribution of personal property; Cross, fees of assessors; Bancroft, to build and furnish school houses; Willis, satisfaction of mortgages when foreclosed; Myers, for fish and game warden; Gates, relief J J Hembee; Hayes, authorizing county courts to offer rewards for criminals; Myers, to provide for filing chattel mortgages; Hirsch, for advancement of reform school; Cross, to provide for laying out and constructing county roads.

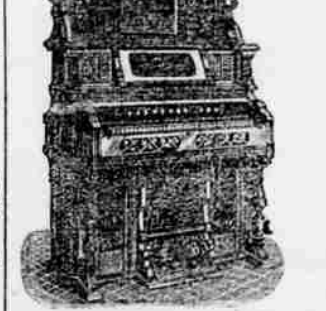
