Smith and Olney are new men and are not known to the general public, but they are said to possess all the essential requisites for official officers. Mr Cleveland has acted wise in making a strong cabinet as no president ever entered the White house with so many grave problems for solution.

South American universities have incomes that compare favorably with older institutions in Europe. Cornell University has as large a revenue as the University of Halle and a much larger invested capital. Harvard last year had \$666,000 income, against \$700,000 for the University of Paris and \$628,000 for the University of Berlin. Gen. Porfirio Diaz has now entered on his third successive term as President of Mexico. It is the fourth term of four years that he has held, he having been elected in 1876, and serving until 1881, when he was succeeded by Manuel Gonzalez. It shows the poverty of Mexico in great and safe men to keep one man so long in power. It is really a confession that the people are not fully prepared to govern themselves, which is probably the fact. A president elected every four years gives them at least the form of a republican government, out of which a truly free government must grow.
