A WHOLESALE MERCHANTS EXCURSION.
The Oregon Pacific railroad company
have arranged to run a Wholesale Mer-
chants' Excursion from San Francisco to
Albany on July 27th. The steamship
"Willamette Valley" will leave with this
party on the evening of that day, arriving
at Yaquina on the 29th or 30th. The
San Francisco Board of Trade will at-
tend this excursion in a party. It is the
intention to entertain them in the same
way that they entertained the Oregon
merchants on their recent trip. It is
desirable that these merchants should
visit as many points in the Willamette
valley as possible. They will be allowed
five days to spend throughout the valley.
Another Merchants' Excursion will
probably be started for San Francisco on
Aug. 14th. All arrangements will be
made to entertain them nicely upon their
arrival in San Francisco.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

A Terrible Accident.

OREGON CITY, July 5.—The celebration
at Gladstone yesterday was marred at its
close by a terrible and fatal accident, which
resulted in the immediate death of Mrs. M.
P. Bradley, followed by the death this
morning of her infant child, while the
three other children were so severely in-
jured that their lives are despaired of. They
were thrown 40 feet over an embankment,
on account of their team getting fright-
ened.

For Horse Stealing

CORVALLIS, July 5.—Sheriff Osburn re-
turned from Empire City this morning,
having in charge Frank J. Peck, alias Frank
Baxter, arrested for horse stealing on a
bench warrant issued three years ago. In
1890 Baxter was representing the Singer
Manufacturing Company in this state, and
while in Corvallis procured a team of
Thomas Elgin to drive to Eugene. As he
failed to return, the sheriff started after
him, pursuing him to the southern part of
the state, and came so near overtaking him
that Baxter left the buggy in the road and
escaped with the team into the brush. He
was afterward captured by the sheriff of
Lane county and sent to the penitentiary
for a year. He had also served a year from
this county for forgery. When arrested
last he had been serving a 60-day sentence
in the Coos county jail for petit larceny.
He admits his guilt and said to Sheriff Os-
burn that he had been expecting a call from
him for some time.

A Peculiar Accident

POMEROY, Wash., July 5.—During the
races at Pataha City today, William Crum-
backer and Charles Mochel attempted to
cross the track as the horses in a running
race were coming down the homestretch.
The last horse struck Mochel, throwing
him against Crumbacker, falling him to
the ground. The horse fell on Crumbacker
and rolled over him. He is unconscious
and will die. Mochel is badly hurt, but
will recover. The jockey was not seriously
injured.

World's Record Broken.

SALEM, July 5.—The World's trotting
record for two miles was lowered on the
Salem track today, that brand new track
which somebody said was slow. It was
the race of the day, and of the season thus
far. The record was 4:48 1-2 until Blondie
chipped off half a second, making it 4:48
flat. Greater speed has been made against
time, but never in a race.

Five Persons Killed by Lightning

GAGGETOWN, Mich., July 5.—A farm
house four miles northeast of this place was
struck by lightning and burned early this
morning. Five persons, a man named Frost,
of Eastoria, and a child of Roberts, were bur-
ied to death. Roberts' daughter was fatal-
ly hurt. Five others in the house escaped.

CHICAGO, July 5.—The indications are
when the counts are all completed they will
show that over 300,000 people visited the
world's fair yesterday. Today opened fair
and cool with a bracing breeze, and crowds
began to flock through the gates early.
