THE ATTITUDE OF PARTIES

The Oregonian quotes a fart of the sliver plank in the democratic platform adopted at Chicago and then says it is utterly impossible to carry it out. It quotes as fol-lows: "We hold to the use of both gold and silver as the standard money of the country, and to the coinage of both gold and silver without discriminating against either metal or charge for mintage." It

then says:

The republican platform is not sound on this question, but does not involve so many difficulties. It declares indeed that "the republican party demands the use of both gold and silver as standard money," but Immediately adds, "with such restrictions and under such provisions as will secure the maintenance of parity." This directly implies restriction of silver coinage, since only by such restriction can parity be main tained. There is error, however, in the use of the term "grandard money," in such conditions, as applied to silver and gold; for gold would be the standard, though a large amount of silver—the volume always a limited—might be used interchangeably with it.

Now, the truth is, that, practically, there is no difference between the money planks in the two party platforms except in the part where democrats denounce the Sherman law. Had the Oregonian been just as candid as one with a search light for truth would be it would have given its readers both planks in full and not garbled them. The demo-cratic plank is as follows:

"We denounce the republican legislation
known as the Sherman act of 1892 as a
cowardly makeshift, fraught with possibilities of danger in the future which should
make all of its supporters, as well as its
author, anxious for its speedy repeal. We
hold to the use of both gold and silver as the
standard money of the country, and to the
coinage of both gold and silver without
discriminating against either metal or
charge for mintage, but the dollar unit of
colnage of both metals must be of equal
intrinsic and exchangeable value, or be
adjustable through international agreement,
or by such safeguards of legislation as shall
insure the maintenance of the parity of the
two metals, and the equal power of every
dollar at all times in the market and in the
payment of debt; and we demand that all
paper currency shall be kept at par with
and redeemable in such coln. We insist
upon this policy as especially necessary for
the protection of the farmers and laboring
classes, the first and most defenceless victims of unstable money and fluctuating currency."

The plank in the republican platform is as follows :

as follows:

"The American people, from tradition and lateres', favor himetallism, and the republican demands the use of both gold and silver as standard money, with restrictions and under such provisions, to be determined by legislation, as will secure the maintenance of the parity of values of the two metals, so that the purchasing and debt paying power of the dollar, whether of silver, gold, or paper, shall be at all times equal. The interests of the producers of the country, its framers and its workingmen, demand that every dollar, paper, or coin, issued by the government; shall be as good as any other. We commend the wise and patriotic steps already taken by our government to secure an international conference, to adopt such measures as will insure a parity in value between gold and silver for ase as money throughout the world."

Thus if will be seen that there is bu alight difference between the two parties so far as platforms go, (and they are usually of no very great moment.) But these efforts going on all over the country to secure party advantage on the eve of the time when congress has been called to settle grave national problems is not entirely creditable to those who eagage in them. Let everybody lay aside this party spirit and contribute all his might to settle these great questions in a way to produce the greatest good to the greatest number.

WHAT IN A CALL LOON

It is a loan which can be cancel ed, "called," at any time, and then the borrower will be required to return the money borrowed, or forfeit the stocks, bonds or other properly that he has put up as security, that is, they will be sold to satisfy the debt. On the New York stock exchange lenders are permitted to call at any time during the day up to 1 o'clock, and borrowers must pay before 2:30 o'clock, failing in which requirement. their security or collateral is sold for the benefit of the lender. Often the collateral required on call loans is a better class than that demanded on loans for a stated period of time. In seasons of great financial excitement like the past week or two, when money flunctuates widely and rapidly, and when lenders see better opportunities to dispose of their money to good advantage, and thus call their loans, they seek the best sort of security in order to adequately protect themselves. On such occasions the value of the collateral always changes in a greater or less degree, and these exigencies necessitate the rejection of all but the best kind of security. - Atlanta Constitution,


