There is a general idea that the President's salary of \$50,000 a year is all that he receives, and that, when compared with the salaries paid the sovereigns of Europe, this sum is not enough. This is a mistake. In addition to his salary, the President receives \$36,064 to pay the salaries of his clerks and subordinates. His private secretary has \$3250; his assistant secretary, \$2250; the stenographer gets \$1800, each of the five messengers \$1200, the steward \$1850, each of the two doorkeepers \$1200, while other employees are paid in proportion, down to the man who takes care of the fires, who receives \$864. In addition, \$8000 is allowed for incidentals, such as stationery and carpets; \$12,500 for repairs and refurbishing; \$2500 for fuel, \$4000 for the greenhouse, and \$15,000 stable, gas and other incidentals. In all, the President and his household costs the country over \$125,000 a year.

A WHOLESALE MERCHANTS' EXCURSION.—The Oregon Pacific railroad company have arranged to run a Wholesale Merchants' Excursion from San Francisco to Albany on July 27th. The steamship "Willamette Valley" will leave with this party on the evening of that day, arriving at Yaquina on the 29th or 30th. The San Francisco Board of Trade will attend this excursion in a party. It is the intention to entertain them in the same way that they entertained the Oregon merchants on their recent trip. It is desirable that these merchants should visit as many points in the Willamette valley as possible. They will be allowed five days to spend throughout the valley. Another Merchants' Excursion will probably be started for San Francisco on Aug 14th. All arrangements will be made to entertain them nicely upon their arrival in San Francisco.

THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD WILL SLASH THE RATES.—Officials of the Northern Pacific Railroad have decided to place low rates into effect. They will sell tickets from Portland to St. Paul for 825 first-class, and make corresponding low rates to all eastern points. World's fair round trip rates will be greatly reduced. ## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

**Three Denver Banks.**

DENVER, July 17.—The People's Savings bank, the Rocky Mountain Dime & Dollar, and the Colorado Savings banks did not open their doors this morning. The statements issued made the following showing:

The Colorado bank shows \$75,064 in excess of liabilities. The officers of the three banks say the debts will be paid in full. It is understood the assignments were prepared for self protection and the protection of depositors. President Lawrence of the People's bank, says the bank had about completed arrangements for temporary relief from Eastern banks, but the doings of the silver men here caused them to withdraw all aid.

**Fired On.**

PORT TOWNSEND, July 17.—The United States man-of-war Mohican was fired upon by the seal poaching steamer Alexandria, in Behring sea May 25, and disabled. The Alexandria escaped. Meager particulars of the battle were received tonight from Oumalaska, via Sitka, on the steamer Topoka. The Alexandria sailed from San Francisco last April, under the Hawaiian flag, on a hunting and fishing voyage in the North Pacific ocean. She was commanded by one of the McLean brothers, who became notorious last year on account of having raided the seal rookeries of the Japan coast.

**The Revolution.**

VILPARAISO, July 17.—Apparently undismayed by the loss of the navy the land forces of the revolutionists in Rio Grande do Sul are more aggressive than ever. Generals Saravia, Tavares and Salgado have combined their forces and are now besieging Yaguaron city. The town is well defended and its capture difficult.

**Salem's Club Disbanded.**

SALEM, July 17.—Salem's baseball team has been disbanded, owing to lack of financial support. The players will leave Friday for their respective homes. Judging from the number of spectators at Sunday's game here, Salem does not want any ball this season.

**The Right Idea.**

OMAHA, Neb, July 17.—Senator Teller, of Colorado, was here today on his way home from a visit to the world's fair. He said: "One of the periodical crises in the world that cannot be avoided is upon us, hence the present deplorable state of affairs in this and other countries."

**Died of Hydrophobia.**

ASHBY PARK, N. J., July 17.—Miss Lizzie Byram, aged 19, daughter of A. J. Byram, manufacturer of patent medicines at New York, died at her summer home here this morning of hydrophobia, the result of a bite from a pet dog, inflicted early in April. The wound was very slight and caused no blood to flow, and for this reason was not cauterized.
