It was not until the close of the old war for independence that much attention was paid to the improvement of the breeds of domestic animals in the United States. In 1783 some horned cattle were imported into Maryland, and passed into the hands of Matthew Patton of Virginia, who took great pains in raising pure stock from them. Some "shorthorns" were imported from England into Westchester County, N. Y., from 1792 to 1796, and these were purchased with the design of improving the breed of American cattle, the first effort of the kind. In 1815 Henry Clay introduced the Herefords from England into Kentucky.

An old program of the Harvard commencement exercises for 1891 records that on that occasion there were orations in Latin, Greek and Hebrew, English poems, forensic disputation, colloquial discussions, and dialogues on questions of the day, besides a number of English orations. An account of the exercises says that "the house was crowded in every quarter, and the circles of ladies were brilliant and animating." The performances were received as the evidence of solid learning and useful application, and the applause they met was judicious and sincere.

On Oct. 3, 1776, the United States congress authorized a loan of \$5,000,000 for the United States, whose faith was to be pledged to the lenders for the payment of the same, with interest. This congress also authorized the establishment of a loan office in each state, and the appointment by the respective states of a commissioner to conduct each office.

A WHOLESALE MERCHANTS EXCURSION.—The Oregon Pacific railroad company have arranged to run a Wholesale Merchants' Excursion from San Francisco to Albany on July 27th. The steamship "Willamette Valley" will leave with this party on the evening of that day, arriving at Ysquina on the 29th or 30th. The San Francisco Board of Trade will attend this excursion in a party. It is the intention to entertain them in the same way that they entertained the Oregon merchants on their recent trip. It is desirable that these merchants should visit as many points in the Willamette valley as possible. They will be allowed five days to spend throughout the valley. Another Merchants' Excursion will probably be started for San Francisco on Aug. 14th. All arrangements will be made to entertain them nicely upon their arrival in San Francisco.

THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD WILL SLASH THE RATES.—Officials of the Northern Pacific Railroad have decided to place low rates into effect. TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

Fighting in Brazil.
New York, July 18.—The Herald's Valparaiso cable says: Vigorous fighting is reported to be in progress in Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil. General Saravia, in command of the revolutionists, pushed forward towards Yaguaron. The advance posts occupied by government troops were taken. Prisoners captured were shot by the revolutionists. The efforts of the insurgents at Santa Ana were unsuccessful. The Castilista forces charged upon the revolutionists and drove them back. Several men were killed. The revolutionists met with a further reverse by the seizure of arms, intended for them, by the Uruguayan authorities in Montevideo.

The Men to Blame.
CHICAGO, July 18.—The coroner's jury investigating the awful fire at the cold storage building on the world's fair grounds last week, in which so many lives were lost, this evening returned a verdict holding to the grand jury for criminal negligence the following persons:
Daniel H. Burham, director of works of the world's fair; Fire Marshal Edward Murphy; J. B. Skinner, president of the Hercules iron works (owning cold storage plant); Charles A. McDonald, secretary and treasurer of the same company.

The Union Pacific.
NEW YORK, July 18.—In regard to the rumor at Omaha that the Union Pacific would have to go into the hands of a receiver, General Manager Dickinson says: "We are in no worse shape than other of the western roads, and if the Union Pacific should go into the hands of a receiver, which I do not for a moment anticipate, it will have several associates in the same business."

A Hoax.
SEATTLE, July 18.—The story sent out last night about the United States steamship Mohican being fired upon and disabled by a six-pound cannon from the steam sealer Alexandria, is now believed to be a hoax. The story was told by G. T. Barrett, of Kodiak island, who came down on the City of Topeka, but the officers of the boat know nothing of the occurrence.

An Old Matter.
NEW YORK, July 18.—Russell Sage has been sued for \$100,000 damages for seduction under promise of marriage. The plaintiff in the suit is Delia Keegan. She alleges the offense for which she now seeks legal redress occurred in 1868, when Sage was a widower. Sage's lawyer calls it blackmail.

JACKSONVILLE, Or., July 18.—Colonel Robert A. Miller returned yesterday morning from his three-month's trip to Washington city, and found his commission as register of the land office at Oregon City, awaiting him. He met a very cordial reception from his many Southern Oregon friends.
