Glycerine is one of the most useful and misunderstood of every-day assistants. It must not be applied to the skin undiluted or it will cause it to become red and hard, but if rubbed well into the skin while wet, it has a softening and whitening effect. Applied to the shoes, glycerine is a great preservative of the leather and effectually keeps out water and prevents wet feet. A few drops of glycerine put in the fruit jars the last thing before sealing them helps to keep the preserves from moulding on top. The steamship "Willamette Valley" will leave with this party on the evening of that day, arriving at Yaquina on the 29th or 30th. The San Francisco Board of Trade will attend this excursion in a party. It is the intention to entertain them in the same way that they entertained the Oregon merchants on their recent trip. It is desirable that these merchants should visit as many points in the Willamette valley as possible. They will be allowed five days to spend throughout the valley. Another Merchants' Excursion will probably be started for San Francisco on Aug 14th. All arrangements will be made to entertain them nicely upon their arrival in San Francisco.

## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

**A Plucky Woman.**  
CHEHALIS, Wash., July 20.—Sheriff Burnett was this morning summoned to Dryad, about 15 miles out on the South Bend branch, by a telegram which stated that there had been a shooting scrape there. The sheriff has not returned and the exact facts are not obtainable, but reports brought down are to the effect that the shooting was done by a woman who believed damaging reports were circulated about her by a man named Brown. The woman's name is Mrs. Swimm, and she is landlady of the hotel at Dryad. She presented a paper to Burnett containing the statement that he had lied about her in circulating the reports and demanded that he signed it. He refused and she drew a revolver threatening to kill him. He fled, closing the door behind him and she shot through the door, seriously injuring him. He then signed the paper.

**Fighting Miners.**  
WICHITA, Kan., July 20.—The expected crisis in the Kansas miner's strike came today. It was caused by strikers declining to allow the miners who are willing to work to do so. Just before noon a band of 500 strikers, who had been marching to the various strip pits, reached Glenon's pit, about a mile south of here. They were headed by 100 women. They sent in a committee to persuade the miners to quit. A refusal was returned, and then the entire band of marchers moved on the works to force them out. The strip men were ready for them, and when they passed the trespass line they were fired upon, and a general battle followed, in which rifles, pistols and clubs were used.

**Boy Burglars.**  
HILLBORO, July 20.—At a late hour last night Justice Knight was called bed to issue warrants for the arrest of two youthful offenders, James and John T. McNamara, on complaint sworn to by G. F. Lefford, charging that while he was at home sick they stole from the store, then in care of his son, a mere boy of 12, eight pocket knives, a box of cigars, some nickels and dimes, and other articles of the like. They were arrested, and, being unable to furnish bail, were sent to jail.

**Base Ball.**  
OREGON CITY, July.—The baseball club here has been strengthened by the signing of Johnson and Strain, two of the members of the now defunct Salem Club. The local managers do not know what arrangements will be made for continuing the league, but there is some talk that Silverton, which has a strong club will be admitted to fill the vacancy. A proposition is being considered to play at Gervais at an early date for a purse of \$100.

**The New Register.**  
OREGON CITY, Or., July 20.—Colonel Robert A. Miller, the newly commissioned register of the land office at this place, was in the city for a short time today, and called upon Captain J. T. Apperson to make arrangements to take charge of the office. It is the intention to make the transfer the 1st of August.
