

A WRONG ATTITUDE.

Senator John P. Jones has been accounted a sensible man, but he will lose his reputation if he keeps on indulging in such talk as that with which he recently entertained a World reporter.

He announces that he and his friends will not permit the repeal of the Sherman act unless the repeal is accompanied by a measure that is satisfactory to the free coinage men. Then he continues:

I can, if I wish, fix up the senate from now until the terms of its members expire. Of course there is likely to be a prolonged debate, Stewart, Teller, Walcott and the rest of us who demand free coinage or something akin to it will have a great deal to say. If we get tired talking a motion to adjourn, to go into executive session, or indeed any motion at all, will continue the delay.

This is not patriotic talk. It is a threat that Mr. Jones and his allies will prevent by factious opposition the majority of the senate from carrying out a constitutional purpose. The silver-mining interest, Senator Jones being its spokesman, proposes to compel all other interests to suffer in behalf of the mine owners. It may be that nine-tenths of our business interests want repeal, but Mr. Jones says he and his friends will not permit it.

This is not the right spirit in which to approach a grave public duty. It is not republican. It is not democratic.

The people of the United States are not hostile to silver either as a metal or as money. But they do object and they have a right to object to sacrificing every other interest to that of silver. The government has dealt more generously with the white metal than it has ever dealt with any other product of labor. Its liberal policy has failed either to sustain the price or to supply a sufficient volume of currency in which the people have confidence.

This is a government where the will of the people must be the law of the land. If that will decrees the stoppage of silver purchases pending a wise settlement of the monetary question, the representatives of the people must find a way to give it effect.

If the senate rules permit a purely obstructive delay, such as Senator Jones threatens, the rules must be changed.—New York World.

The Oregonian would make its readers believe that the stringency of the times comes as a result of the election of a democratic president. This is so puerile and senseless as to add to the discredit in which that paper is held when talking politics through the editor's hat. When a ship is laboring in a stormy sea the passengers and crew do not stop to dispute about the responsibility of bringing her into danger. They devote themselves to trying to save the ship. This is what patriotic Americans are thinking about now. When the time comes to consider the responsibility the people will remember under whose administration the surplus was squandered, the reserve gold sent abroad, the Sherman act passed, the taxes increased and calamity organized.

Prince Bismark in retirement has just been making a speech surprisingly unlike his old policy while he was in power. He now is trying to arouse State pride and the reassertion of State powers in order to check the tendency to centralization, which would make Prussia everything and all else of Germany nothing. It is through the States that German liberties are to be preserved, if they can be preserved at all. It has done Bismark good to lose power. This position is much more statesmanlike than his old one. It is the policy on which the German future must be built to stand secure. The day of Imperialism supreme has passed, as Emperor William may find.

The appointment of H. C. Evans, of Ottumwa, Ia., son-in-law of general Weaver, indicates official appreciation of the aid given the democrats by the populists in the presidential election. This is right. If the populists were good enough to receive the votes of dyed-in-the-wool democrats, they are good enough to hold office under a democratic administration, and it would be rank ingratitude not to appoint them.—Oregonian.

Mr. Evans is a thorough going democrat and hence all the "sweetness" in the above is lost in the desert air.

A scientist says 383 species of spiders have been found in the Upper Cayuga Lake Basin, 370 in the District of Columbia and 340 in New England. From the Polar regions, 292 species are reported.

It has been calculated that over 60 per cent of the earthquakes that have been recorded have occurred during the six colder months of the year—the maximum number in January and the minimum in July.

Though the Department of Agriculture makes no estimate at present of the coming wheat crop, the information it gives shows that the winter wheat crop will not exceed 250,000,000 bushels, and may not be more than 200,000,000. The condition is 74, against 86 a month ago and nearly 97 last year. Poor wheat in the spring seldom gains much afterward. The spring wheat condition is also very poor, and its yield will not exceed 150,000,000 bushels, and will probably not reach that figure.

The New York World says Cleveland's policy for the coming special session will be: First—Silver reform, by the absolute and unqualified repeal of the Sherman law. "Second—Tariff reform, to be prosecuted in accordance with the pledges of the party, as soon as, but not before, the finances of the country are again upon a stable basis."

One of the most ardent advocates of the Sherman Silver-Purchasing act in Congress was Representative McKinley, now Governor of Ohio. He then declared that act would solve the silver question by bringing silver to an actual parity with gold and insure free coinage. To hear him talk about it now, however, one is led to think he must have been out of his mind then or has gone daft since.
