Greenwood Cemetery, Brooklyn, has grown of late years to be extremely valuable. It occupies 474 acres in what now is a thickly settled part of the city; it is a fashionable place of burial, and lots there have appreciated enormously in value. It is said that last year the trustees took in about \$300,000 for interments. Forty years ago a man bought a lot there for \$1800, and afterward was buried in it. His son has been offered \$20,000 for the lot, and wants to sell it and remove his father's bones to a less expensive resting place. He was about to carry out the plan when the law was invoked, and the Supreme Court has just rendered a decision declaring the inviolability of graves, and exempting them from speculative use. It promptly forbids the disturbing of buried remains and their removal to less valuable sites.

A WHOLESALE MERCHANTS EXCURSION.

The Oregon Pacific railroad company have arranged to run a Wholesale Merchants' Excursion from San Francisco to Albany on July 27th. The steamship "Willamette Valley" will leave with this party on the evening of that day, arriving at Yaquina on the 29th or 30th. The San Francisco Board of Trade will attend this excursion in a party. It is the intention to entertain them in the same way that they entertained the Oregon merchants on their recent trip. It is desirable that these merchants should visit as many points in the Willamette valley as possible. They will be allowed five days to spend throughout the valley. Another Merchants' Excursion will probably be started for San Francisco on Aug. 14th. All arrangements will be made to entertain them nicely upon their arrival in San Francisco.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

The Official Figures.

WASHINGTON, July 28.—Controller Eckels takes exception to the recent dispatches which have appeared in the newspapers stating that 200 national banks have failed since January 1, and is out today in a state-ment showing that 105 have passed into the hands of the controller. Fourteen of these banks have already resumed business, two of them being the First National, of Palouse City, Wash., and the Washington National, of Spokane.

Kicked in the Face.

EUGENE, Or., July 28.—Hon J. M. Spores, who lives on the Mohawk, 10 miles east of here met with a very serious accident yes-terday. He was riding one horse and lead-ing another, when the one he was leading turned and kicked, striking him fairly in the face. A terrible gash was cut down the chin, and the flesh of the right cheek from the corner of the mouth to the eye was torn loose, breaking the chin bone. He is now doing fairly well and will recover in a few weeks.

In Chicago

CHICAGO, July 28.—State Superintendent McElroy, of Oregon, arrived yesterday to attend the sessions of the National Educa-tional Association. Today he took a bird's-eye view, visiting Oregon's exhibits. As a member of Oregon's world's fair com-mission, Professor McElroy says he is well pleased with the state's exhibits and is sur-prised at its completeness compared with many other states which made larger approp-riations. Professor B. J. Hawthorne, of the state university, and Professor John M. Bloss, of the Oregon agricultural college, are also doing the fair.

Exploded

SAN DIEGO, Cal., July 28.—News has been received here of the tragic death of L. Spangler, formerly of Illinois, and one of the most prominent American ranchers in Lower California. Spangler lived in San Rafael valley, where a large crop is being harvested. He had lately secured a steam threshing machine, and being temporarily without an engineer, he had taken charge of the engine himself. He fed cold water into the boiler, which produced an explosion resulting in his instant death.
