The Southern Pacific Express company, of Kentucky, Wells Fargo & Co. of Colorado, as citizens of other states, has filed a bill of equity in the circuit court of Los Angeles to determine the ownership of \$5000 for the capture of the outlaw Chris Evans. The reward for the capture of Sontag has been paid, but the other reward is claimed by two sets of men.

The heads of Surveyor-Generals W Henry Byars, of Oregon, and Amos F Shaw, of Washington, will probably soon fall into the basket and one of the seven applicants in Oregon and ten in Washington will probably be selected. Charges have been filed against both of these officers, and the papers are ready for the return of the president, when an effort will be made to have them removed.

It is currently rumored that United States Senator A C Beckwith will on Monday next tender his resignation. While Governor Osborn declines to discuss the matter, it is generally believed that he will immediately appoint Collector A L New to fill the position. New is the chairman of the democratic state committee, and came within two votes of being elected senator at the session of the legislature in February. It is understood that animosity over recommendations for federal appointments has caused Beckwith to take this action.

We do not want cheap money, that is, when we get money into our possession we do not want it to be cheap. The more it will buy, the less cheap it is and the more we prize it. If a man has wheat which he wishes to sell he does not want it to be cheap. We always want that to be cheap which we have not, and that to be dear which we have. But, aside from all this conflicting selfishness, we, at no time, and under no circumstances, want one kind of dollar that is cheaper than any other authorized dollar. The official railway mileage of Oregon, according to the fourth annual report of the interstate commerce commission, was 1411.12 miles, in addition to which there were 6 1/2 miles which had not been reported to the commission, making a total June 30, 1891, of 1417.62 miles. The increase over June 30, 1890, was 19.07 miles. The number of miles per 100 square miles of territory was 1.33. The number of miles of railway per 10,000 inhabitants was 45.23. The number of miles in California per 10,000 people was 37.13; per 100 square miles of territory, 2.93. The number of miles in Washington per 100 square miles was 3.13; per 10,000 population, 58.88. The mileage of Washington has been considerably increased by the completion of the Great Northern to Seattle.

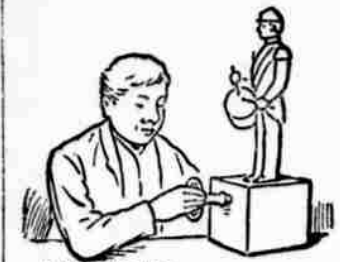

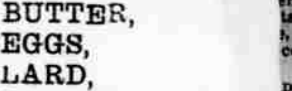
