A dispatch from London says: "A meeting was held today at the official residence of the lord mayor, to consider the financial and business situation. It was presided over by the lord mayor. The gathering was very largely attended. Among those present were: Right Hon A J Balfour; Right Hon Henry Chaplin, formerly president of the board of agriculture; Right Hon Sir John Lubbock, of the firm of Roberts, Lubbock & Co., bankers; Hon Thomas F Bayard, American ambassador to Great Britain; Dana Horton, and most of the leading bankers of London. Balfour made an address and disclaimed political motives. He alluded to the anxiety felt throughout the business world connected with the currency changes in India and the action that might be taken by the United States government. The gold standard, Balfour declared, would never satisfy commercial wants, while a double standard alone would prevent dangerous oscillations in trade. He condemned isolated action on the part of individual states, and recommended an international agreement, fixing a ratio of value between gold and silver. In the course of his address Balfour denied the advocates of bimetalism aimed at an inflated currency. This might be true, he said, of some bimetalists connected with the Western states of America, but it did not apply to the bimetalists of Europe, who believe the adoption of bimetalism would prove the safest commercial policy. In the event of a European war the double standard would, according to Balfour, be found very advantageous. The meeting adopted a vote of thanks to Balfour for the address.
The fire losses during the first half year of 1893 exceed those for the same part of 1892 by over \$20,000,000, and the difference between the exhibits for June, 1892, and June, 1893, is over \$7,000,000. During June there were 188 fires of a greater destructiveness than \$10,000 each.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

An Improvement.
NEW YORK, Aug 5.—R G Dunn & Co., in their weekly review of trade, say: "Demoralization in speculative markets has been followed by a more healthy tone and heavy imports of gold inspire hope that monetary troubles may abate. The week has been one of surprises. Enormous liquidation in wheat brought the lowest price ever known on Tuesday. The crash of the pork ring took 45 per cent from the nominal price of that product in one hour and caused several failures for millions each. Wheat has recovered about 4 cents and pork 25 or more at Chicago, and orders for exports have caused a sudden advance in ocean freights. With the great surpluses of wheat brought over from previous years, the country will be able to meet all demands."
The Program.
WASHINGTON, Aug 4.—As soon after congress meets as it becomes practicable, Representative Bland, the leader of the silver forces in the house, will introduce a bill embodying the views of the silver men. It will provide for the repeal of the Sherman purchasing act and substitute therefor the free coinage of silver, at the present ratio of 16 to 1. "That," said Mr Bland today, "will be the ground upon which we will make the fight."
The Revolutions.
VALPARAISO, Aug 4.—Hard fighting is accompanying the siege of La Plata, where Governor Costa, of the province of Buenos Ayres, is practically cut off from communication with the capital by the revolutionary troops who are investing the city. A correspondent in Buenos Ayres telegraphs that the provincial force has made repeated efforts to cut its way through the lines of the national troops but has failed. During these engagements 400 men have been slaughtered. Another revolution has been started in the province of Corrientes against the governor.
Will Close.
PITTSBURGH, Pa. Aug 4.—It is stated on good authority that the Allegheny Bessemer steel works of the Carnegie Steel Company, at Duquesne, will close down tomorrow for an indefinite period. The announcement was made to the workmen that the works cannot run longer, as the company has not sufficient orders to warrant a continuance of work. The works employ about 800 men.
A Common Occurrence.
BOISE, Idaho, Aug 4.—State Treasurer Hall today received a dispatch from Stanton Coffin & Co. of New York, who contracted to take the state wagon road bonds, stating it would be impossible for them to take any more of the bonds at this time, and that they do not know when they will be able to do so. Only one lot of \$2800 has been disposed of. This will necessitate the postponement of the building of the roads.
