TARIFF IN THE SENATE.

In his message President Cleveland says it was his purpose to summon congress in special session early in the coming September that it might "enter promptly upon the work of tariff reform, which the true interests of the country clearly demand, which so large a majority of the people as shown by their suffrages, desire and expect, and to the accomplishment of which every effort of the present administration is pledged."

September is but a few weeks away and the probabilities are that the intermediate time will be fully occupied with the financial legislation which the president now deems of paramount importance, although he says tariff reform "must in the near future engage the attention of congress." It would be in keeping with the position of the administration for congress to follow up its financial legislation by the immediate consideration of a tariff bill. It has a right to do so at the present extra session without waiting for special recommendation to that end by the president. Congress is not bound, in extra session any more than in regular session, to limit its action to the subjects mentioned in the call or the message, or to adopt the suggestions of the president. Nor can the president limit the time of the session, special or regular, except that in case of disagreement of the two houses as to time of adjournment he may adjourn them to such time as he may think proper.

The probabilities are that upon the appointment of the committee on ways and means the work of tariff investigation, preliminary to the construction of a new tariff bill, will be at once entered upon.

DECIDED.

The decision of the Behring sea tribunal of arbitration has been handed down. Five points of article 6 are decided against United States. Close season is established to begin May 1 and to continue until July 31. This close season shall be observed both in the North Pacific ocean and Behring Sea. A protected zone is established extending for sixty miles around the island. Pelagic sealing is allowed outside the zone in Behring Sea from August 1st. The use of fire arms in sealing is prohibited. American arbitrators have expressed their satisfaction with the text of the decision.

American arbitrators believe that the regulations decided upon by the tribunal mean practically the end of pelagic sealing and that they are better terms than were heretofore offered to the United States by Great Britain as a settlement of the question involved.

The thousand dollar ear-ring of a Baltimore girl has made a long journey and come back in safety. She missed it after a shopping excursion and advertising brought no trace of it. Some weeks later a city millinery firm received a letter from an Alabama customer stating that the bonnet she ordered had come all right and that she was pleased to find a diamond among the lace trimmings. Not thinking that it was a present from the firm, she said that she was anxious to return it to the owner if she could be found. This is a specimen of feminine honesty that is refreshing, since the Alabama girl could doubtless have kept the jewel without question.

The present value of wheat in English markets is a little below 80 cents a bushel and only six times in 238 years has it been below this figure. In 1688 and 1732 the average was 72 cents; in 1745 it was 75 cents, and 77 cents was reached in 1628 and 1733. In 1733 the average was 79 cents. Since then, 159 years ago, wheat has not been as low as at present. The highest price was \$3.85 in 1812. It went above \$2 in thirty-one years.

Local telegrams are now transmitted through pneumatic tubes in most of the principal cities of Great Britain. At present about 50 miles of such tubes are in operation, requiring an aggregate of 400-horse power, and transmitting a daily average of 165,000 messages or 30,000,000 annually.

The Imperial Canal of China is the longest in the world and the greatest in point of traffic. Its length is 2100 miles, and it connects 41 cities situated on its banks. It was completed in 1353, and after 600 years spent on its construction.

The Herald's statement that Senator Mitchell of Oregon has gotten into trouble about banks at Milwaukee, Wis. is an error. It is Senator Mitchell of Wisconsin.

The president has sent to the senate the name of Chas A Page, of Astoria, to be collector of customs for the district of Oregon.

THE TRUE POSITION.

A reader of the DEMOCRAT wants to know what position the democrats took on the silver question in their platform adopted at Chicago. The following is the silver plank in the platform:

We denounce the republican legislation known as the Sherman act of 1890 as a cowardly makeshift, fraught with possibilities of danger in the future, which should make all of its supporters as well as its author anxious for its speedy repeal. We hold to the use of both gold and silver as the standard money of the country, and to the coinage of both gold and silver without discriminating against either metal or charge for mintage. The dollar unit of coinage of both metals must be of equal intrinsic and exchangeable value, or be adjusted through international agreement, or by such safeguards of legislation as shall insure the maintenance of the parity of the two metals, and the equal power of every dollar at all times in the markets, and in payment of debt; and we demand that all paper currency shall be kept at par with and redeemable in such coins. We insist upon this policy as especially necessary for the protection of the farmers and laboring classes, the first and most defenseless victims of unstable money and a fluctuating currency.

The gist of the above is that whatever dollar is provided for must be as current as any other legal dollar.

The tariffites declare that trade is languishing because the democratic party is menacing the tariff, but the iron and steel products of the country for the first six months of this year show an increase over the corresponding time last year. The only trouble on the tariff question is political.

Minister Blount has arrived at San Francisco on the Gaelic, from Honolulu. He would talk but little about the Hawaiian affairs. They were quiet when he left. Advice from other sources are to the effect that Blount favors continuance of provisional government under the protection of the United States.
