Comptroller Eckles knows more about
the national banks that have failed than
does any other man in the country. His
view is that from now on the business of
the country will progress to more favorable
conditions. Nine out of ten of the sus-
pended banks, he says, will resume opera-
tions, and he adds that the failure of a
bank in times like the present does not
necessarily mean bad banking methods.
Some which failed have been among the
most successful and are all right now so
soon as it becomes possible to realize on
their assets. Mr. Eckles's advice to panicky
depositors is to stand by the bank and thus
maintain public confidence. The lack
of this is mainly the trouble now.

Ohio's sheep statistics for the past year
have just been tabulated and they do not
present a very strong endorsement for Mc-
Kinleyism. On the contrary, they show
a decrease of 153,065 in Ohio's flocks, and
therefore continue the former testimony of
facts against the alleged benefits of the pro-
tection of wool, which is in reality the pro-
tection of fancy-ram breeders. In 1867
Ohio had 7,159,177 sheep, and wool was
worth 31 cents a pound. At present Ohio
has 3,729,542 sheep, and choice Ohio
fleeces are worth 25 cents a pound. Mean-
while the cost of clothing of every man,
woman and child in the country is heavily
increased by this absurd legislation.

Will Coin Gold

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—Secretary Car-
lisle has ordered that the United States
mints at Philadelphia and San Francisco
be fully manned and the full capacity of
of both mints utilized in coining gold bul-
lion. The treasury department possesses
from \$85,000,000 to \$90,000,000 in gold
bullion, which is part of the gold reserve of
\$100,000,000. Gold bars cannot be used as
currency, so it has been decided in the
present need to coin the bullion on hand.
The bullion will be coined into \$10, \$5 and
\$2 1/2 gold pieces, preference being given
to the first two denominations.

Did Praying Do It

BRIDGETON, N. J., Aug. 28.—R. M. Wills,
secretary of the county board of excise
commissioners, was found sitting in his
office-chair yesterday, suffering from
paralysis. He was removed to his home,
where he died a few hours afterward. Aug.
15 the Woman's Christian Temperance
Union, in the Methodist Episcopal church
prayed that the excise board do not grant
any licenses. The next day the women
prayed that God would remove the excise
board if the board granted any more licen-
ses. The women also prayed at Pittman
Grove, August 16, that the board decline to
grant any more licenses.

A Contentible Deed

WALLA WALLA, Aug. 28.—News of a
dastardly attempt at dynamiting, the full
accomplishment of which would have re-
sulted in many lives being lost, reached
this city today from near Dayton. Dynamite
was placed in the threshing machine of
Mr. Butler. The explosion blew out the
cylinder and generally wrecked the ma-
chine. Two men were seriously hurt. There
is no clue to the perpetrators or the motives
which actuated the deed.

No Extra Session

SEATTLE, Aug. 28.—Governor McGraw,
when informed today at Olympia that the
senate had refused to seat John B. Allen,
his appointee as senator from Washington,
said: "I will not call a special session to
fill the vacancy unless some great emer-
gency arises or unless a majority of the people
of the state demand it."

Railroad Building

ROSEBURG, Aug. 27.—Manager R. A.
Graham, of the Roseburg & Coos Bay rail-
road, is here, and will return to the bay in
a few days and continue pushing operations
on the road. He says he has a force of 30
teams at work behind the engineers this
side of Myrtle Point. A large force is
engaged in ballasting the road between
Coquille City and Myrtle Point.

Good Effects Already

NEW YORK, Aug. 28.—The news of the
passage of the Wilson bill was received
with general satisfaction. Henry Clews
says the effect is as anticipated, and it has
already benefited commercial centers of the
west.
