In reply to a resolution, Secretary Carlisle sent to the senate a statement to the effect that during August and the first seven days of September the department redeemed in silver coin \$4,473,874 in treasury notes; that only \$30,577.87 in silver had been coined under the law, and that no paper money was redeemed by the payment of gold since March 4 except the gold certificates that had been canceled.

The house committee on the election of president and vice-president and members of congress has ordered a favorable report on the bill repealing the federal election law. The democrats expect to give it exclusive attention in the house after Thursday. A bitter partisan fight is expected.
