**The Session.**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—The weary struggle in the senate goes on and on, and tonight little progress seems to have been made toward settlement. The silver men still have the upper hand and control the situation. Several senators were excused on the plea of illness and fatigue, and the quorum diminished to the danger line, and then disappeared. It was broken by the refusal of certain silver democrats to vote. Finally, at 1:40 a m., when it was found impossible to get together a quorum, Yeomans rose and said he felt he had done his duty in the matter, and moved an adjournment. The motion was unanimously agreed to, and in an instant the senate chamber was deserted, after a continuous session of 38 hours and 40 minutes.

**Afternoon Predicted.**

SAVANNAH, Ga., Oct. 12.—Savannah is in the teeth of a storm which threatens in a few hours to equal in intensity that of Aug. 27, which swept the entire Georgia and South Carolina coast. The prediction of the weather bureau of its approach gave warning, and all day preparations were in progress in the city and on the river and harbor to protect property from its ravages. The wind this evening is blowing 60 miles an hour and is steadily increasing.

**Gold sent to Washington.**

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 12.—It is reported that \$4,000,000 of gold were shipped from the sub-treasury here to Washington today. The federal officers refuse to confirm or deny the statement. It is positively known however, that Wells Fargo's express received forty heavy boxes from the sub-treasury and forwarded them east on the Central Pacific.
