Samuel Blackwell, third auditor of the treasury, in his annual report states that during the past year there has been an enormous increase in the pension disbursements. The number of vouchers paid by pension agents has increased year by year from 1,226,119, involving \$59,906,501, in 1883, to 3,669,009, involving \$155,071,506.98, in 1893. This is an increase of 200 per cent in 10 years, while the clerical force has increased from 49 to 64.30 per cent only, in the same period. At the close of the fiscal year there were in the office unexamined 1,284,310 pension vouchers, representing about four months work. A lack of room to keep the records intact is mentioned. The auditor states that pension vouchers are accumulating at the rate of \$4,000,000 a month, and adds: "I cannot see how the office can, without additional filerooms, preserve the records as the law requires."

## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

### A Big Train Wreck.

BATTLE CREEK, Mich., Oct. 20.—The error of one human being—of a man who crouches afflicted in a prison cell tonight—led to the greatest railroad holocaust in the history of Michigan today, and 26 human lives paid "the penalty of a moment's negligence. Two trains, both laden with passengers, met in a direct head-on collision on the Grand Trunk railroad at 3:45 this morning in the suburbs of this city, and that the number of dead and injured was not fourfold greater is due to the circumstance that the collision occurred in the suburbs of the city, where the trains slackened speed. As it is, 26 charred, disfigured and unrecognizable bodies lie in the morgue tonight, and 27 mangled and bleeding victims are groaning in agony in the charity hospital.

### An Old Story.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 20.—There is excellent reason for saying that before the middle of next week the repeal bill will pass the senate, to take effect not later than October 1, 1894, probably with a provision authorizing the secretary of the treasury to issue bonds not exceeding \$200,000,000 and to coin the reagenture now in the treasury. This, it is said, would not be considered a surrendered by the administration.

### Finances in Peru.

LIMA, Peru, Oct. 20.—The house of deputies has taken hold of the financial situation. The minister of finance obtained a secret session and explained the financial difficulties of the country. The senate appointed a special committee to investigate and to recommend an immediate remedy. One result of the agitation in the passage by the house of deputies of the first clause of a bill re-establishing gold as the currency of the country, and prohibiting the importation of silver coins.

### May Fight in England.

LONDON, Oct. 20.—Mr. Fleming, of the National Sporting Club, received a cablegram last night from Dave Holland, of New York, asking what course he would give for a fight between Coburn and Mitchell. A meeting of the directors of the club will be held as early as possible, and no doubt every effort will be made to have the fight settled in London.

### The Wrong Color.

NEW YORK, Oct. 20.—The Herald's Valparaiso dispatch says the Bolivian consul there says that while it is not probable his government will refuse to accept Charles J. Taylor as minister, it is not regarded as an act of policy on the part of President Cleveland to send a colored man as minister to a white republic.

### St. Paul Gentlemen

ST. PAUL, Oct. 20.—W. V. Evans, formerly cashier, and C. A. Hawks, formerly assistant cashier of the Seven Corners bank, have been indicted by the grand jury on a charge of converting to their own use over \$100,000 of the bank's funds.
