The Philadelphia Record says: Notwithstanding the alleged prostration of the woolen industries, the imports of foreign wool during the last eight months fall little short of the imports during the corresponding period of 1892.

It is true enough, as the returns of trade plainly indicate, that the finest fleeces of Argentina and Australia do not come to this country, because the excessive McKinley tariff too greatly enhances the cost to American manufacturers.

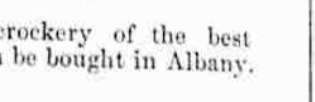
