

A TYPE OF A PARTY

John Sherman is described, in the Washington dispatches which report his late speech in the senate, as being "firm and showing the evidence of advancing decay."

Such a seeming was not out of place with the occasion and the deliverance. In that speech Sherman was the repentant sinner. In the shadow of his passing, this incarnation of republican ideas and policies recants. But "the ruling passion strong in death" leads him to the hypocrisy of attempting to prove that, although his sin be upon his own head, its curse should fall upon the head of those who, when the crime of the Sherman bill was first proposed, raised voice and hand against it.

John Sherman has become a pathetic figure in our public life. During the years of his mental and physical activity he was the evil genius in our finances. It is a fitting termination of such a career as his that its closing years should find him seeking to undo the evil of his own making. It is a confession of crime; a cry in the darkness; a voice of remorse.

Let us not misjudge him. He was the chief among sinners, but he was not alone among the money changers in this temple. Without the republican party Sherman would have been impotent to work the wrongs and injuries upon the people which he has committed in the name of republicanism.

In the name of that party and with its consent and support he first began the contraction of the currency for the benefit of European creditors. In its name and with its consent and support he cast out the silver dollar in 1873. In its name and with its consent and support he suspended silver coinage in 1891. In its name and with its consent and support he degraded silver to a commodity to be paid for in gold. There is no crime of which Sherman is guilty of which the republican party is not equally guilty.

In every scheme of legal robbery he has proposed; in every Shylock plan for the robbery of the debtor by the creditor he has invented; in every artifice conceived by him for destroying real and creating artificial values of money, the republican party has been a partner. It has shared in the spoil. It has defended him against a just retribution. And with him it now approaches the confessional.

Sherman has grown a multi-millionaire on a senator's salary. But other republicans have grown rich with him. It has been with that party a carnival of jobbery and robbery out of which the rich have grown richer and the poor poorer. The world never before saw so many rascals unwhipped of justice as the republican party by its financial and fiscal policies has set in high places. It has ground the faces of the poor and set its heel on the necks of the toilers. Sherman is its type. And like him it is giving "evidence of infirmity and advancing decay." - E.

Does the governor really believe that the late congress has by ill advised legislation made gold alone full legal tender money? If so it is high time he were looking into the silver question and legislation. The late congress did not legislate at all on the matter of legal tender.

Report has it that when the prayer in the governor's proclamation reached a throne of grace the word was promptly sent back: "Tell Penroyer to attend to his business and I will attend to mine."

The Chinese exclusion bill extending the time for the Chinese to register six months has passed the senate. It now awaits the signature of the president.

CHICAGO'S MURDERED MAYOR

With solemn pomp and imposing ceremonies befitting the interment of the chief magistrate of the world's fair city and his dramatic fate, Carter H. Harrison's body was escorted to Graceland cemetery by an immense throng of sorrowing citizens. All night long two lines of people passed steadily by the bier on which the remains lay in state in the city hall corridor. The crowd about the city hall gradually decreased toward morning, as those who had stood in line for hours to get a last glimpse of the familiar features passed into the flower decked corridors, but the early comers soon lengthened the lines again, and when finally the time arrived for beginning the ceremonies of the day, and the doors were closed, it left a vast throng on the outside who were debarred the privilege of seeing the peaceful features of the departed chief executive. After the doors closed, tenderly the remains were borne from the black draped corridor and placed in the funeral car. Through a great crowd, gathered to see the murdered mayor's last leaving of the scene of his labors in behalf of the city he loved, the black car slowly passed and took its place in the waiting procession. As it drew into line the march was taken up and the thousands who had gathered to honor the dead moved slowly through the crowded streets with banners draped, to the sad music of the funeral march by bands distributed at intervals through the long line. Out from the center of the city a great procession marched across the river to the beautiful church of the Epiphany, near the late executive's home. All along the line of march people with sad faces and bare heads watched the somber column, and about the church a throng as great as that which stood about the city hall was gathered. The remains arrived at the church, were carried in and deposited in front of the chancel, where in an impressive manner the solemn service for the dead was performed. At the close the procession took up the line of march to Graceland cemetery.
