According to the Portland Welcome nearly every body in Portland will observe Thursday November 30th (the day designated by President Cleveland) as Thanksgiving day, and not the day designated by Governor Percey.

WHAT DAY IS THANKSGIVING?

Thanksgiving day is peculiarly an American institution. After harvest in the New England colonies in 1621 Governor Bradford appointed a day on which the people should meet and rejoice together in prayer and praise to God. This was instigated, not by legislative enactment, but sprang from the zeal of puritanism which had taken such deep root in the New England mind. This was the beginning of Thanksgiving. It is said that a day of fasting and prayer held on account of a great drought in 1623 was changed into a day of thanksgiving by the coming of rain during the prayers. In those days it became a custom to appoint a day of thanksgiving after harvest. The day was named by the governors of the New England states in a public proclamation. During the revolutionary war, days of thanksgiving were frequently recommended by congress. After the adoption of the constitution Washington recommended such a day and the example was occasionally followed by other presidents. President Lincoln frequently recommended the observance of such a day after national victories. He issued a proclamation for the observance of such a day in 1863. Since that time such proclamations have been issued annually by the successive presidents. Custom has fixed upon the last Thursday of November instead of the fourth Thursday as stated by the Oregonian, Statesman and other papers. Usually November has but four, Thursdays and hence Thanksgiving usually has been on the fourth Thursday. In 1882 and 1883 it occurred on the fifth Thursday.

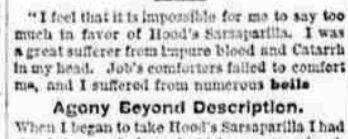

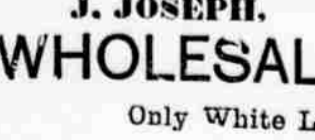
