A PUZZLING QUESTION.

One of the most puzzling questions that have been presented to the American people in recent years is what to do with the crank who carries a revolver. So frequently are great crimes repeated and the horrible deeds of one crank emulated by another that many people have come to regard it as a rule that "murders go in groups."

Investigation into the conduct of the villainous slayer of Mayor Harrison discloses the startling fact that he had been debating the matter of assassinating President Cleveland and at least one United States senator. Following upon the report of Prendergast's pistol came the visit of a crank to young Gould of New York with a demand for money and presumably, prepared to enforce his demand. There is no safety, no place to draw the line upon this class of murderous spirits.

Men in all walks of life, statesmen, ministers, educators, capitalists and public officials, have come within the scope of the crank's hatred and the reach of his aim. There is in this country though in no wise the outgrowth of the spirit of our institutions, a spirit of emulation of violent deeds, a distorted vision that clothes with a mock heroism the perpetrators of atrocious crimes. The great ambition of the crank is to be a martyr. He reposes in the felon's cell as in the arms of fame, hence ordinary punishments meted out to felon have no terror sufficient to deter him from the commission of horrible deeds.

His life is a menace to society itself, for in the pursuit of vengeance for an imaginary wrong he is willing to endanger every innocent life. The public hall, the private office, the sacred circle of the home are to him as the field to the hunter. He pursues his victim with ever increasing hatred, and ever expanding ideas of his own importance. The solution of this problem seems almost hopeless at first glance, yet the American people will be compelled to find some means of securing greater safety. There should be little delay in getting such characters speedily and permanently out of reach of the public. A crank working for the state is better than a crank pursuing a citizen with murderous intent. The utmost caution should be used in the admission of such fellows to homes or even to public offices. And above all, there should be a united effort upon the first manifestation of this murder mania to get the maniac put out of the way of doing harm.

A few days ago we published a little clipping purporting to be from the Baker City Democrat in which the editor tells how "Harvey Scott in the Evening Telegram whacks Harvey Scott of the Oregonian on the financial question, and the next morning Harvey Scott of the Oregonian whacks Harvey Scott of the Evening Telegram in a most unmerciful manner. The spectacle is that of a man attempting to kick himself."

Our attention has been called to the fact that it should have been credited to the Roseburg Review. The Democrat clipped it from some paper that credited the article to the Baker City Democrat. We want to do both the Review and the Baker City Democrat justice, hence we make this correction.

For the information of "One Who Wants to Know" we have to say that it is a fact that the universal custom with the presidents of the United States and the governors of this state to name the last Thursday in November as the day of Thanksgiving. It frequently happens that there are five Thursdays in November in which case Thanksgiving is placed on the fifth Thursday instead of the fourth.

Thanksgiving occurred on the fifth Thursday in the following years: 1866, 1871, 1877, 1882, 1883, and 1892.

The Statesman labors very hard to make it appear that Thanksgiving day occurs on the fourth instead of the last Thursday in November. To strengthen this position it says that the New York World almanac for 1893 says: "November 23, 1893—Thanksgiving Day is observed in all the states though in some it is not statutory." Now we have the world Almanac for 1893 before us and it says the above except it has November 30 instead of "November 23." We leave the Statesman to explain to its readers this mistake.

For the information of Governor Penney who will issue one more Thanksgiving proclamation we have to say that November of next year will have five Thursdays.

A railroad, splendidly equipped, was built out into the timber for logging purposes. This it was given out was to be completed to Astoria immediately. The whole business has been sold by the sheriff and will not pay 10 cents on the dollar to creditors.

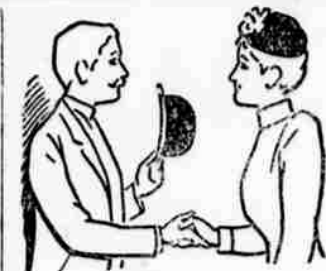

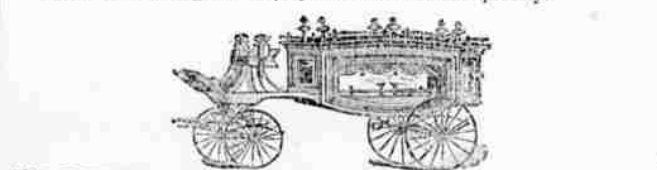

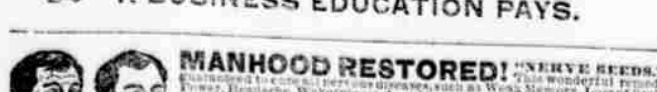
