CURE FOR A FELON.

As soon as the disease is felt put directly over the spot a fly-biater about the size of the thumb nail, and let it remain for six hours. At the expiration of that time, directly under the surface of the blister may be seen the felon, which can be instantly taken out with the point of a needle of lance. It would be well to remember this, by those so afflicted, as it certainly will afford relief of many weary hours of excruciating pain.

It has been definitely decided by the finance committee on way and means that an income tax will be adopted as a part of the new revenue system. The details of the plan have been left to McMillan, Bryan and Montgomery. The changes in the internal revenue schedule contemplate an increase of 10 cents a gallon on whiskey and slight modifications on the tobacco tax. Several hundred petitions today inundated the committee from the tobacco manufacturers of the United States, asking that the McKinley tariff import duty of \$2 per pound on leaf tobacco in suitable wrappers be repealed, and a duty of 35 cents a bushel be imposed on all leaf tobacco. It appears to be the intention of the committee to reduce the duty from \$2 to about \$1 a pound. The latest proposition regarding the sugar schedule, and the one likely to be adopted, is to make the duty ad valorem instead of a specific rate. It will probably be 25 per cent, which amounts to one-half a cent per pound on 2-cent sugar and 1 cent per pound on fine sugar worth 4 cents.

Comparatively few people came from Europe to visit the World's Fair. Instead of doing a larger business than usual, the foreign steamships did less. They had a few number of steerage immigrants, and owing to the Fair not so many wealthy Americans took their summer trip to Europe. The distance of Chicago from the sea coast was one reason why so few Europeans came here this year. Another probably was that times have been quite as close in Europe this year as they have been in this country.

The United States Mint turned out in the month of October 6,444,749 pieces, valued at \$8,029,910. They were made up of 536,820 eagles and 453,320 half eagles, 18,000 half-dollars, 354,000 quarter-dollars, 200,000 dimes, 800,000 nickels and 4,013,000 cents. Total value gold, \$7,844,800; silver, \$105,000, and base coin, \$80,100; grand total, \$8,029,900.

A Big Split.
KANSAS CITY, Nov 24.—A secret meeting of the Kansas populist was held tonight in this city. It was learned from an authentic source that action which will probably result in a split in the party in Kansas was decided upon. It is said that among those present today were Jerry Simpson and 60 others, all high in the populist circles. From authentic sources it is stated the meeting denounced in most unqualified terms the Kansas administration of the populists as "rotten, entirely incompetent and silly." They then renounced all principles as put forth by the populists up to date, and declared for a new party, and from how on they will put forth every effort to obtain the free and unlimited coinage of silver, leaving other planks of the former party to be taken care of as might be.

Frightened to Death.
New Brunswick, Nov 24.—Twelve-year-old Mary Powell, of Prospect Plains, this county, went to the cellar last night, and while she was ascending the stairs her brother made a mournful sound and slammed and locked the door. The girl screamed in terror, but the boy kept her locked in. All at once the screams ceased, and when the door was opened the girl was dead. A physician, who was summoned, said her death was due to the shock produced by her fright. Her brother, who is thus apparently responsible for her death, is ill from remorse.

Killed by a Marble.
TRENTON, N.J., Nov 24.—Arthur Turner aged 20 years, was shot and almost instantly killed yesterday afternoon by John Vetta. The latter had a gun loaded with powder, upon which he put a large marble. Turner stood against a tree and dared his companion to shoot. Vetta pointed the gun and fired, the marble striking Turner in the middle of the forehead. He walked about 50 feet and fell dead. The marble fractured his skull. Vetta was arrested, but Coroner J. D. Bower released him, believing that the shooting was accidental.

WASHINGTON, Nov 24.—Washington has settled down into the belief that the first authentic news as to whether instructions in the Hawaiian complication will be laid before the country in President Cleveland's message to congress, when it reassembles Monday week. It is believed the president's message will be sent in the day of convening.

Very Cold.
Nov 24.—Thermometers in various parts of the city registered 15 to 16 degrees below zero early this morning. Like reports are being received from all over the state, and also from North Dakota and Manitoba. Colder weather is promised. Sank Rapids, Minn, reports 24 below, and Fargo, S. D., 25 below.

WASHINGTON, Nov 24.—Inquiry among senators and members has developed a very general belief that there will be an effort next year, possibly early in the year, to bring about another international conference for the purpose of securing some recognition of silver.
