

DON'T FORGET.

We have given credit freely to the republicans in congress for their support of the repeal bills in both houses. Their attitude has been none the less true patriotism because it happened to be also good politics. But when the republican organs claim for their party the lion's share of the honor it is in order to remind them of a few things.

Don't forget that it is a republican silver purchase law which congress was called upon to repeal. Every vote for the "cowardly makeshift" was a republican vote. The executive approval which made it a law was given by a republican president.

Don't forget that the impending deficit is a republican legacy. It was decreed when the Reed congress expended a billion dollars, adding \$70,000,000 to the regular annual appropriations.

Don't forget that the loss in the gold surplus occurred under a republican administration. Mr Harrison received from President Cleveland in 1889 nearly \$45,000,000 in free gold above the \$100,000,000 reserve. It was only by borrowing from New York bankers that Secretary Foster could show a beggarly and fictitious surplus of \$929,000 when the democrats came back.

And don't forget finally that the greater part of the filibustering against a vote has been done by republican senators, under a republican code of rules.

The World has recognized the full responsibility of the democrats for whatever is done at Washington. But when republican partisans put on too much of a swell front it is necessary to remind them of their dreadful past, for which the people scourged them out of power.—World.

The New York Herald's Washington correspondent claims to give an accurate outline of the new tariff bill, so far as determined. These are the most salient points of reform:

The free list to include nearly all the raw and crude materials which enter into manufacturing wools. The hair of the camel and goat, bituminous coal, iron ore, lumber, salt, silver, lead ore, flax, hemp and jute, and a large number of chemicals will all be free. Woolen and linen manufacturers will also get the benefit of an extension of time from three to six months to work off the finished products. Steel rails will probably be 88 or 89 per cent. Pig iron will be put at 55 ad valorem, and bar iron will be reduced at least 55. Tin plate will be charged 1 cent per pound. The specific duties on cutlery are abolished and an ad valorem duty substituted. Block tin and copper ore are on the free list, and there is a uniform ad valorem duty upon finished manufactures of wool, but logs are free.

The committee believes a reduction of from 50 to 100 per cent in silk duties will yield as much revenue as now. Woolen goods will follow the rates in the Springer bill, but some goods, especially cloth, will be put in a separate class at 30 per cent. All the manufacturers of cotton will be taxed 40 per cent. This includes hosiery manufacturers. Flax hemp and jute will be greatly reduced in view of placing the raw material on the free list. Binding twine is likely to be made free. The high duties on agricultural products will be mercilessly slaughtered. The duty will be retained on lemons and oranges, but several other fruits will go on the free list. The wrapper tobacco duty will be reduced to \$1 or \$50 when stemmed, and 50 cents more a pound when stemmed. An ad valorem rate of 25 per cent on all grades of sugar is suggested, although this question is still open. The duty on gloves is reduced. There is no increase on beer, tobacco and cigars, but there is an increase on whisky. The proposed duty on sugar will bring in about \$30,000,000, and it is thought some \$50,000,000 or \$10,000,000 will be received from the increase on whisky and from the income tax.
