

THE FREE LIST.

The articles placed upon the free list in the new tariff bill are:

Bacon, ham, beef, mutton, pork, meats of all kinds, prepared or preserved, not otherwise provided for; baryta, binding twine made in whole or part ofistle or tampoio fibre, manilla, sisal or sunn, single ply, measuring not more than 600 feet to the pound; stuffed birds not suitable for millinery, bird skins prepared for preservation; blue vitrol, bone, gas coal, bituminous and shale and slack or cut; coke; coal tar; colors or dyes not specially provided for; oxide of cobalt, copper ores, old copper, clippings from new copper, all compositions of which copper is the chief component of value, regulus and black copper, and copper cement, copper plates, bar, ingots, pigs and other forms; coppers; cotton ties; diamond-dusts or bort, jewels for the manufacture of watches and clocks; yolks of eggs of birds, fish and insects; crude down; fresh fish; undressed furs; iodine; resublimated iron ore, including magniferous iron; dross of burnt pyrites, sulphur of pyrites in natural state; lard; lemon juice; mica and crude metallic minerals and unwrought metals, ochre and and ochery earths, sienna and sienna earths, amber and amber earths; cotton seed oil; paintings and statuary.

Plows, tools, disc harrows, harvesters, reapers, drills, mowers, horse rakes, cultivators, threshing machines and cotton gins; plash black for making men's hats; quacksilver, salt, silk not further advanced in manufacture than carding and combing; soap, not otherwise provided for; sulphate of soda, or salt cake or nitrate cake, sulphuric acid; tallow and wool grease; straw, burrstone bound into millstone, freestone, granite, sandstone, limestone or monumental stone, except marble undressed; all wearing apparel and other personal effects on identity being established under regulations to be established by the treasury; timber, hewn and sawed, spar and wharf timber, square and sided timber, sawed boards, planks, deals, other lumber, lath, palings, shingles, staves and manufactured wood, provided the same duties as now exist shall obtain in all cases in which an export duty is laid on any article in the above schedule; chair cane or reeds; woods, namely, cedar, lignum vitae, lancewood, ebony, box, granadilla, mahogany, rosewood, rattanwood, all forms of cabinet woods, in the log, rough or hewn, manufactured brier root or brierwood, reeds and sticks of patriidge, hairwood, pimento, orange, myrtle or other woods in the rough; all wool of sheep, hair of camel, goat, alpaca and other like animals; wool and hair on skins; nails, yarn, waste, card waste, burr waste, rags and flags, including all waste or rags composed wholly or in part of wool.

Portland coal-dealers must prepare to reduce prices 75 cents per ton when the Wilson bill shall have gone into effect.—Oregonian.

Great Scott! the truth has been wrung from the Oregonian at last. The victory is a great and far reaching one. Years of hard campaigning have been devoted to the effort, and now we rejoice in a great success. Gentle reader, are you curious to know what this victory is? It is one of truth over falsehood, right over wrong. It is this: The Oregonian in the editorial above admits a truth that it has been denying for years—that the tariff is a tax. It says that dealers in coal in Portland must reduce the price 75 cents a ton when the Wilson bill goes into effect. Fastidious that consumers of coal will get it 75 cents cheaper by removing the present duty of 75 cents. Because if removing the duty will make it 75 cents cheaper to the consumer, putting the duty on would make it 75 cents dearer. Hence the conclusion is inevitable that the tariff is a tax, and that the consumer pays it. This point democrats have contended for, for years, but not until now has the Oregonian admitted the truth of this claim. Well, we suppose the few thousand of coal mine owners in this country will be opposed to this change, but the hundreds of thousands of families all over the country will hail with delight the advent of cheaper coal. This is doing good for the masses instead of the classes. Verily "the world do move."

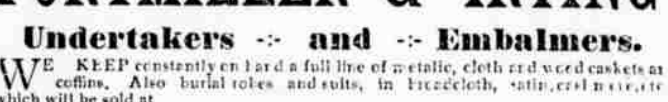
